of the Idaho Department of Water Resources ("Department" or "Director") issued Amended Final Order Creating Water District No. 170 (a copy of the order is posted on the Department's website: http://www.idwr.idaho.gov/wate r/districts/UpperSalmon.htm). That order established Water District No. 170 to include all surface water and ground water rights in the Idaho Department of Water Resources Administrative Basins 71 and 72, other than de minimis domestic and stock water rights as defined by sections 42-111 and 42-1401A (11), Idaho Code. Existing water districts located within the boundaries of Water District No. 170 are designated as sub-districts of Water District No. 170 by the Director's Amended Final Order. The order provides that sub-districts shall be responsible for distribution of water rights within their respective boundaries upon holding an annual meeting to elect a watermaster and adopt a budget in accordance with provisions of chapter 6, title 42, Idaho Code.
