Dear Andy:

Developments in your area over the past few years suggest we re-assess the summer operations on the North Fork and its' tributaries. Increased activity in pumping operations, with many permits of late priorities, subsequent to Teton Reservoir storage rights for instance, make it mandatory that we intensify our monitoring of all pump diversions.

Records of canal and ditch diversions in your district are very good. Gage readings are at regular intervals and current meter measurements are of a frequency that readings are constantly well defined. Some of this effort must now be expanded to cover all pump diversions. Water District No. 01's budget is being increased slightly for the 1975 year to allow for this added work load.

Complications on Squirrel and Conant Creeks require closer surveillance than in the past, with regular readings and measurements at key points.

With your concurrence, I would propose the following method of operations in your area beginning this coming season.

1. Evaluate all your canal ratings, and those that do not change significantly measure less frequently.
2. During flood season, enlist the help of canal watermasters to keep a record for you of their gage readings. Furnish them standard U.S.C.S. gage books to record their observed readings. This would release your hydrographer one or two days a week to check on pumps and other diversions.
3. After flood rights are cut, and the usual once-daily gage readings are begun, one of your hydrographers could spend perhaps one day a week reading all your gages, with no time on measuring. This releasing the other to concentrate on pumps and the creeks. This would be possible if current meter measurements were made at less frequent intervals at a number of canals and the interval extended slightly at others.

4. To avoid having to visit Squirrel Meadows too often, we may investigate hiring someone in the immediate area to read gages frequently or have our observer at Squirrel do it, thus concentrating only on trips to get measurements. Water-users on Squirrel Creek would also furnish readings to assist in evaluating the Squirrel Creek operations.

The above are tentative recommendations. No doubt adjustments will have to be made as the season progresses, but it is hoped that a routine can be established that will ensure that all decreed rights are adequately protected with a minimum of extra expense. Of course, Water District No. 01 will assist directly as in the past, in implementing these procedures.

# WATER DISTRICT NO. 01 ANNUAL MEETING

March 3, 1975

Resolution No. 1. That the following transmission losses be charged on stored water: 1.7% Moran to Palisades; 0.8% Palisades to Heise; 4.4% Heise to Lorenzo; 0.5% Lorenzo to Woodville; 6% Woodville to Blackfoot; 4% Henry's Lake to Island Park; 2% Island Park to Warm River; 0.5% Warm River to Ashton.

Resolution No. 2. That an attempt to establish pre-reservoir conditions, stored water when released from reservoirs shall be charged a reasonable amount to cover lag and river bank storage, said amount to be repaid to stored water by natural flow before the close of the irrigation season.

Resolution No. 3. We recommend that Arthur L. Larson be elected Watermaster for the ensuing year, including a staff of an assistant and a clerk for an aggregate annual salary of \$34,500, which amount is 50% of the salary and benefits obligation for the three-member staff. The remainder of the salaries of these employees as determined by Federal Civil Service and Geological Survey regulations shall be paid from non-Water District funding sources.

Resolution No. 4. Resolved that the duties of Watermaster shall begin on this date and continue for a full period of one year.

Resolution No. 6. We recommend that the Committee of Nine be continued with nine regular members. The members representing the Burley and Minidoka Irrigation District are to be alternated between the two districts as they may arrange. In addition, advisory members representing the Bureau of Reclamation, Teton Basin, Gooding Canal, and a member from the Burley or Minidoka District, whichever is not currently represented on the regular committee, be included. Any canal company or district desiring to have representatives attend meetings of the Committee of Nine should notify the Watermaster, who will then advise them of dates and times of Committee meetings so that they may have an opportunity to attend such meetings.



Resolution No. 7. WHEREAS, in the operation of the Water District No. 01 it is necessary to borrow money at times to meet expenses of operation prior to collections from the canal companies at the close of the irrigation season,

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Watermaster, or Acting Watermaster in case of his absence, is hereby authorized to borrow from time to time during the year ending March 31, 1976, such sums as are necessary to pay outstanding bills, signing notes as authorized officer of District No. 01 as security therefore, the total amount of any such outstanding indebtedness at any one time not, however to exceed \$30,000.00.

Resolution No. 8. WHEREAS, the operation of the storage pool committee in past years has proved to be of valuable assistance to the Watermaster in providing an orderly distribution of rental water,

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that a pool committee again be appointed by the chairman of the Committee of Nine for the following purposes:

1. To determine general policy regarding source of rental water;
2. To assist the Watermaster in the allocation of rental water;
3. To consult with the Watermaster on ways to most fully utilize available storage water.

Resolution No. 9. WHEREAS, it has long been the policy of Water District No. 01 to urge and promote orderly development of the water resources of the State of Idaho and the commencement, when practicable, of development of the upper stretches of our rivers to prevent waste by flooding and to obtain maximum use of the water as it flows through our state; and

WHEREAS, the Bureau of Reclamation is presently preparing a report and formulating a plan for multiple-purpose project at the Lynn Crandall site on the South Fork of the Snake River to provide, among other things, much needed supplemental water for irrigation of lands now under cultivation, as well as to provide water for arid lands which are not now irrigated, and at the same time to serve as a regulating reservoir for the Palisades Project;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that Water District No. 01, meeting in Idaho Falls, Idaho, this 3rd day of March, 1975, re-affirms its long standing position favoring a multiple-purpose project at the Lynn Crandall site on the South Fork of the Snake River and urges the prompt completion by the Bureau of Reclamation of the report and proposal for a multiple-purpose project at that site.

Resolution No. 10. WHEREAS, Water District No. 01 has consistently endorsed the early authorization and construction of the Salmon Falls Division Project; and

WHEREAS, Idaho water users appreciate the authorization of the project in 1972;

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved, that Water District No. 01 meeting this 3rd day of March, 1975, in the city of Idaho Falls, Idaho, urges early appropriation of funds to initiate construction of the project.

Resolution No. 11. WHEREAS, Water District No. 01 has long supported the Lower Teton Project, and

WHEREAS, The project has been authorized after full consideration by all interests and is now under construction,

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that we re-affirm our support of the Lower Teton Project on the Teton River and urge that all steps be taken necessary to fund and complete on schedule the construction of the project.

Resolution No. 12. WHEREAS, legislation has been introduced before the Congress of the United States which would place a large portion of the Middle Snake River within a National Recreation Area, and

WHEREAS, the water users of Water District No. 01 have always opposed the inclusion of any portion of the Snake River or its tributaries under the further control of governmental agencies when the effect would be to retard or prevent the orderly development and use of water for agricultural purposes;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that Water District No. 01 opposes that particular legislation which would establish a Hells Canyon Recreation Area with the inclusion of a portion of the Snake River therein.

IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED that Water District No. 01 opposes any other legislation which proposes the inclusion of any portion of the Snake River within a National Recreation Area or a National Scenic Area or which would designate any portion of the Snake River as a wild or scenic, or national river.

Resolution No. 13. WHEREAS, the states downstream from Idaho have proposed to establish minimum flows on the Columbia River, and

WHEREAS, the water users of Water District No. 01 of the State of Idaho have always favored multi-purpose development and upstream storage, and have opposed plans which would interfere with established water rights and limit or prevent orderly use and development of water resources within the State of Idaho;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the water users of Water District No. 01 are opposed to any plan which would establish minimum flows in any of the rivers or streams carrying the waters flowing out of the State of Idaho; and are particularly opposed to any unilateral establishment of a minimum flow by a downstream state which demands the waters of Idaho.

Resolution No. 14. WHEREAS, the administration by E.P.A., Region X, of the N.P.D.E.S. Permit Program under P.L. 92-500 has created potentially serious threats to established water rights in Idaho and possible substantial financial obligations on irrigation water users;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that Water District No. 1 encourages all wateruser organizations in the district to unite in opposition to the arbitrary interpretations being given to the N.P.D.E.S. Program under P.L. 92-500 by Region X, E.P.A. and that all irrigation organizations support satisfactory amendments to P.L. 92-500.

The Water District 01 Annual Meeting was held March 3, 1975 at Idaho Falls. The 14 resolutions attached were adopted. Included in the resolutions are the re-election of Art Larsen as water master and the setting of his budget. The only new issue treated by the resolutions is the request for unified opposition to the NPDES program administered by EPA (Resolution No. 14).

As you know, much of the meeting consists of reports by the Bureau of Reclamation, Corps of Engineers, Soil Conservation Service, and Idaho Water Users Association. I believe it would be appropriate for our Department to have a similar part in the program each year.

RE: WEST BONNER WATER DISTRICT #1 - OPINION #22-75

I have reviewed your proposed opinion and find that I cannot concur in your conclusion that water can be appropriated in Idaho for use in Washington.

I believe that §42-411 must be considered controlling as to the State of Washington. The general statute, §42-408, should be considered as superceded by the specific statute, §42-411. To hold otherwise would have the effect of saying that the legislative action of enacting §42-411 was a nullity. I don't believe sound principles of statutory interpretation will allow you to come to that conclusion.

In support of the above, I direct your attention to the fact that §42-411 as originally submitted (by the Department of Water Resources) did not contain the last restrictive clause. It would therefore seem painfully obvious that the legislature did intend a result different than the general statute, and in fact intended to limit appropriations to use in Pullman, Washington.

I also feel that the two statutes cannot be reconciled without ascribing to the legislature the intent of performing a nullity. I would, therefore, be of the opinion that water cannot be appropriated in Idaho for use in Washington except in Pullman, Washington.

Dear Mr. Higginson:

Confirming our recent telephone conversation, we are writing to request a brief written statement on the official position of the Department of Water Resources with respect to the disposition of the water rights of the Rockford Canal Company. As we have indicated, the Rockford Canal Company is the owner of certain natural flow, flood, and storage rights, on the Snake River in Southeastern Idaho. These rights are represented by shares of stock in the Aberdeen-Springfield Canal Company and only recently, the Rockford Canal Company entered into a formal agreement with Aberdeen-Springfield Canal Company defining the nature and extent of these rights and providing that the Aberdeen-Springfield Canal Company would cooperate with Rockford Canal Company in an effort to transfer these rights. As you are also aware, all of the lands formerly served by the Rockford Canal Company to which the water rights in question were applied are now served by ground water pumping. The Rockford Canal Company is presently negotiating with an entity downstream in the Snake River Valley, which proposes to purchase these water rights for ultimate use in development of its project.

The matter about which we are concerned has arisen during negotiations for the transfer of these water rights. We have been advised, second and third hand, that an official in the Department of Water Resources made some statement or raised a question about whether the Rockford Canal Company actually owns any water rights, which can be transferred.

You are of course aware, because of discussions with several attorneys and canal company officials over the past few years, of the Rockford Canal Company's desire to transfer these water rights. It has always been our understanding that the department's official position was in favor of such a transfer and that the department would cooperate and assist as far as allowed by law, in this effort. We would very much appreciate a confirmation from you in writing of this position. We think that it will be helpful in facilitating the negotiations and transfer of water rights by the Rockford Canal Company.

Re: Rockford Canal Company - Disposition of Water Rights

Dear Kent:

Thank you for your recent letter raising the question concerning the position of this Department with regard to the proposed transfer of water represented by shares of stock held by the Rockford Canal Company in the Aberdeen-Springfield Canal Company.

You are well aware that Section 42-108 of the Idaho Code provides that, where water in a system is represented by shares of stock in a corporation, no change in the point of diversion or place of use of such water is to be allowed by this Department without the consent of the corporation. It has always been our feeling that in the event the Rockford and Aberdeen-Springfield Canal Companies could work out an arrangement between them, that a transfer filed by Rockford would be proper and would be given favorable consideration by this office. Left to be decided is the question of what, if any, transportation loss should be charged against the right, depending on where the water is to be moved.

The question raised by an employee of this office may have been with regard to the general proposition of moving water from one canal to another where the water appeared to be surplus to the canal company's need. That is not the case here, because you can specifically identify the lands from which the water has been removed and the lands to where it is proposed to be transferred. You are correct in your understanding that the Department would look favorably towards such a transfer, provided other rights are not injured and provided the change does not constitute an enlargement of the use of the original right.

Please let me know if you have any further questions concerning this matter.

This cause came on for hearing this 10th day of September, 1975, in chambers of the above entitled court, at St. Anthony, Idaho, before the Honorable Willard C. Burton, District Judge. Ray W. Rigby of Rigby, Thatcher & Andrus, P.A., Rexburg, Idaho, appeared with and on behalf of the Plaintiffs. The Defendant did not appear either in person or by counsel, and he has not filed any pleading in this action. No person has appeared to object to the granting of the prayer of Plaintiffs' complaint. Documentary and other evidence was submitted to the court on behalf of Plaintiffs; and the court, being fully informed as to the facts and the law, now FINDS, CONCLUDES, ADJUDGES and DECREES as follows:

FINDINGS OF FACT

As Findings of Fact, the court finds as follows:

1. That at the time of the filing of the complaint, the Defendant, Arthur L. Larsen, was the duly elected, qualified, and acting watermaster of Water District No. 1 of the State of Idaho; that he was duly served with summons in this action, together with a copy of the complaint; that a Notice of Pendency

and Purpose of Action was published in the Ashton Herald for three successive weeks, and said newspaper has general circulation in the area involved in this matter; that defendant has not appeared nor entered any pleadings in this action, nor has he made any objection to Plaintiffs' complaint; that the time allowed by law in which to appear and plead has now expired, and the default of said Defendant has been duly entered; that said Defendant is not in the military or naval service of the United States of America at this time, nor was the said Arthur L. Larson in the military or naval services of the United States of America at the of filing the complaint herein.

2. That no other person or persons whomsoever have appeared in this action by pleading or otherwise, to Plaintiffs' complaint; that the time in which any person or persons may appear and plead or object to the Plaintiffs' complaint has now expired.

3. That the Plaintiffs Edward R. Bowman and Florence N. Bowman, his wife, are the owners and in possession, and have been for many years last past, of the following described property situated in Fremont County, State of Idaho, to-wit:

4. That the Plaintiff Ivy May Moon is the owner and in possession, and has been for many years last past, of the following described property situated in Fremont County, State of Idaho, to-wit:

The S $\frac{1}{2}$  of NW $\frac{1}{4}$ , the SW $\frac{1}{4}$  of the NE $\frac{1}{4}$  and the

That immediately after the 19th day of August, 1891, the said Samuel Sadorus and Son constructed the diversionary works described in said Notice and diverted 1,000 inches of said waters of Lower Sand Creek or Spring Creek, a tributary of Henry's Fork of the Snake River, by diverting the water from what is known as "West Lake" with a point of diversion located on the southerly end of said lake in the NW $\frac{1}{4}$  of the NE $\frac{1}{4}$  of Sec. 11, Twp. 9 N., Rge. 41, E.B.M., in Fremont County, Idaho, into a channel which is partly natural and partly man made, and which empties into what is known as "East Lake"; and the said Samuel Sadorus and Son then diverted the waters of both the said "West Lake" and "East Lake" at a point on the southerly end of said "East Lake" in the SE $\frac{1}{4}$  of the NE $\frac{1}{4}$  of said Sec. 11, Twp. and Rge. aforesaid, and ran said waters through the natural channel of said lower Sand Creek or Spring Creek, which channel was improved and modified, leading in a Southeasterly direction to the properties owned by the Plaintiffs and described above, where several irrigation ditches were constructed and said waters applied to a beneficial use upon Plaintiffs' above described properties. The amount of the water available for diversion diminishes during each irrigation season.

7. That the channel which connects said "West Lake" and "East Lake", and from which Plaintiffs have diverted and applied to beneficial use the above described waters has been variously known as "Lower Sand Creek" and more recently as "Spring Creek."

8. That the predecessors in title of the Plaintiffs Mary S. Moon as Plaintiff and Joseph W. Bowman as Defendant, litigated the ownership and right of possession of the land and water of the plaintiffs described above; and the above entitled Court did, on March 17, 1925, decree the ownership and right of

possession of said property and said water rights, as between the said parties, but did not determine points of diversion nor dates of priority of the water rights nor quantity of said water rights; nor was said litigation in the nature of an application for a supplemental decree.

That on the 22nd day of May, 1899, the said S. S. Sadorus, together with John Moon and Joseph W. Bowman filed in Book "A" of Miscellaneous at Page 327 of the official records of Fremont County, Idaho, Notice of Claim for Reservoir for the storage of the above described waters.

12. That the Defendant, Arthur L. Larson, is the duly elected, qualified and acting Watermaster of Water District No. 1 in the State of Idaho, and has jurisdiction over the distribution of the waters of the Snake River within the areas in which the lands of the Plaintiffs are located.

13. That all of the lands owned by the Plaintiffs are arid lands and require the application of water by irrigation in order to raise agricultural crops; that the waters claimed by the Plaintiffs and their predecessors and hereinbefore described are necessary to fully and adequately irrigate the lands of the Plaintiffs, hereinbefore described so as to produce maximum crops thereon.

14. That the Plaintiff Ivy May Moon is the owner and possession, and has been for many years last past, of the following

described property situated in Fremont County, State of Idaho,  
to-wit:

The SW $\frac{1}{4}$  and the S $\frac{1}{2}$  of the SE $\frac{1}{4}$  of Sec. 12,  
Twp. 9 N., Rge. 41, E.B.M.

That the plaintiff, Ivy May Moon, obtained title to said described premises through a series of mesne conveyances from Samuel Sadorus to Hugh Moon to Samuel Moon, to Ivy May Moon, the Plaintiff.

15. That the Plaintiff Ivy May Moon is the successor in interest, through a series of mesne conveyances, from Samuel Sadorus to Hugh Moon to Samuel Moon to the said Ivy May Moon and also from John Moon to Mary S. Moon to Samuel Moon to the said Ivy May Moon of two certain waters rights, the first of which was recorded on May 23, 1889, in Book "A" of Water Locations at Page 233 for 200 inches of the waters of Lower Sand Creek, the second recorded on July 25, 1894, in Book "A" of Miscellaneous at Page 306 for 500 inches of "First or East Lake or Lower Sand Creek".

16. That immediately after the said May 23, 1889, Water Location was filed, Plaintiff Ivy May Moon's predecessors in title constructed a series of ditches, pursuant to said notice, and pursuant to the notice filed on July 25, 1894, and diverted 200 inches of the said 700 inches from said Lower Sand Creek, now known as Spring Creek, with a point of diversion in the SE $\frac{1}{4}$  of the NE $\frac{1}{4}$  of Section 11, Twp. 9 N., Rge. 41, E.B.M., and applied said water to beneficial use upon the SW $\frac{1}{4}$  and the S $\frac{1}{2}$  of the SE $\frac{1}{4}$  of Sec. 12, Twp. 9 N., Rge. 41, E.B.M., in Fremont County, Idaho, and also used said water to supplement the water described above, upon Plaintiff Ivy May Moon's land in said Sec. 13, Twp. and Rge. aforesaid, for the production of crops and pasture thereon, with said water right dating from the said 23rd day of May, 1889, and continuously thereafter.

17. That the Plaintiff Ivy May Moon and her predecessors in interest have not been made parties to any suit adjudicating the waters of Snake River, and said waters claimed by the Plaintiff have never been adjudicated in any suit brought for the purpose of adjudicating the waters of said Snake River and/or its tributaries.

18. 21. That each and all of the allegations set forth in Plaintiffs complaint have been proven by competent and satisfactory evidence to the court and are found to be true. fac



CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

As a Conclusion of Law, the Court concludes that the Plaintiffs, Edward R. Bowman and Florence N. Bowman, his wife, should be decreed 500 inches, and the said Ivy May Moon, a widow, should be decreed 500 inches of the waters of the West Lake and the East Lake "Lower Sand Creek or Spring Creek", tributaries of Henry's Fork of the Snake River, with the date of priority of August 19, 1891, for the irrigation of the following real property belonging to Edward R. Bowman and Florence N. Bowman, his wife, located in Fremont County, Idaho, to-wit:

The N $\frac{1}{2}$  of the N $\frac{1}{2}$  and the SE $\frac{1}{4}$ NE $\frac{1}{4}$  of Section 13,  
Twp. 9 N., Rge. 41 E.B.M.

and the following real property belonging to Ivy May Moon, located in Fremont County, State of Idaho, to-wit:

The S $\frac{1}{2}$  of the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ , the SW $\frac{1}{4}$  of the NE $\frac{1}{4}$  and the  
NW $\frac{1}{4}$  of the SE $\frac{1}{4}$  of Sec. 13, Twp. 9 N.,  
Rge. 41 E.B.M.

As a further conclusion of law, the Court concludes that the plaintiff, Ivy May Moon, a widow, should be decreed 200 inches of the waters of "Lower Sand Creek or Spring Creek", tributaries of Henry's Fork of the Snake River, with the date of priority of May 23, 1889, for the irrigation of the following real property belonging to Ivy May Moon, located in Fremont County, State of Idaho, to-wit:

The SW $\frac{1}{4}$  and the S $\frac{1}{2}$  of the SE $\frac{1}{4}$  of Sec. 12,  
Twp. 9 N., Rge. 41, E.B.M.

With a point of diversion located on the Southerly end of "West Lake" in the NW $\frac{1}{4}$  of the NE $\frac{1}{4}$  of Sec. 11, Twp. 9 N, Rge 41, E.B.M. in Fremont County, Idaho, and conducted by means of a channel which is partly natural and partly man made, and which empties into "East Lake", and said waters of "East Lake " and "West Lake" are diverted at a point on the Southerly end of said "East Lake" in the SE $\frac{1}{4}$  of the NE $\frac{1}{4}$  of said Sec 11, Twp. and Rge. aforesaid, and then conveyed through the natural channel of lower Sand Creek or Spring Creek, to the plaintiff's property described above. Let judgment be entered accordingly.

I was disappointed recently to receive a copy of a Judgment and Decree entered by Judge Burton in the matter of Edward R. Bowman, Florence N. Bowman and Ivy May Moon, which was filed under the Summary Supplemental Adjudication procedures of the statutes. Apparently, when you were served with the complaint, you failed to notify the Department so that we could look into the matter and provide you with legal counsel as to how to proceed. The result is that we now have a decree which provides 500 inchewater rights for 200 acres and for 160 acres of land with no data apparently available to the court to determine whether that water supply for that small of acreage is excessive.

I will appreciate it in the future if, when any such complaints are filed with you, that you immediately make them available to the Department so that we can take whatever action may be appropriate.
