# Water District 100 Advisory Board Meeting (Draft) Fremont-Madison Irrigation District 01/14/2009

Dale Swensen called the meeting to order at 1:15 pm. Those in attendance were, Ernie Carlsen (IDWR), Gene Hansen (IDWR), Wendy Murphy (IDWR), Dale Swensen (Fremont-Madison Irrigation District), Kenda Jones (IDWR), Heather Bohac (IDWR).

Minutes were read by Kenda Jones. A correction was made to John Millar's name. Dale Swensen moved to accept minutes, Ernie Carlsen seconded the motion and the minutes were passed.

Wendy Murphy presented the financial report. The Profit/Loss statement shows total income reported from 02/08-01/09 as \$5934. Assessments income was \$5869, \$260 above the budget of \$5600. Total expenses for the year were \$7273. This is over the budget of 5600.00 by \$1673. Net income is -1338.67. Balance sheet shows a bank balance of \$12,317. The Accounts payable balance is \$270. Accounts receivable were \$-988.68. Total liabilities and equities is \$11,328.98. A/R summary shows there are three people with outstanding balances.

Ernie Carlsen then suggested changes to the resolutions. He first suggested Gene Hansen serve as Watermaster for the year 2009, as he is the most familiar with the area and handles most customers in this area. Ernie discussed the "Memorandum of Understanding" document and the need for this contract to be in place. This can be approved at the WD100 annual meeting. Ernie talked about the budget for 2009. There will be an additional 80 hours added, as this is the first year Watermaster services will be included. Alan Kelsch will replace Dale Rockwood as WD100 Treasurer. He is currently serving as WD 1's Treasurer. Gene Hansen, whom will replace Ernie as WD100 Watermaster, will also be designated as an authorized signator for banking purposes.

Gene Hansen explained Notices of Violations for water users watering outside of their water rights and the need for them to be compliant. He presented a slideshow and highlighted the features of Arcmap that help us identify water usage issues. He discussed the time that is involved with monitoring/measuring rate and volume process, as well as the costs. Department duties and responsibilities were discussed and 2009 resolutions were reviewed. Item #2 of the 2009 Resolutions will read "Gene Hansen is elected the Watermaster for WD100. That the Director of IDWR appoints Gene Hansen, an employee of IDWR to provide Watermaster services for the ensuing year." Item #4a will be deleted. Item #4b will become 4a and will read: "The 2009 budget for Water District 100 will be set at this annual meeting." Item 4b will read: "Water District 100 will provide compensation to IDWR for clerical and financial support services, Watermaster services and measuring and reporting services". The possibility of Received.

becoming part of WD100 was discussed and Gene relayed there are certain issues keeping that from taking place at this time.

Heather Bohac reviewed a Pilot Project that is taking place at Egin Lake that involves replenishing the Snake River Aquifer. This is a pilot project and seems to be showing positive results to date.

Dale Swensen motioned to adjourn the meeting. Ernie seconded the motion. Meeting was adjourned at 2:30 p.m.

#### Water District 100 Steering Meeting 1/15/08 Fremont-Madison Irrigation District

Ernie Carlsen called the meeting to order at 1:15 pm. Those in attendance were Ernie Carlsen, IDWR; Wendy Murphy, IDWR; Dale Swensen, Fremont-Madison Irrigation District; John Millar, City of Rexburg; Gene Hansen, IDWR; Guy A. Erikson, Blake Jordan, IDWR; Lisa Purvis, IDWR; and Richard Crapo.

The minutes were read and reviewed. There were 2 corrections. In the 2<sup>nd</sup> paragraph and 5<sup>th</sup> paragraph where it says 110 it should read 100. Dale Swenson moved to accept the minutes with changes, John Millar seconded the motion and the minutes were passed.

Wendy Murphy presented the financial report. There is a copy attached. The budget was under spent due to personnel changes, Blake Jordan was hired mid-year and the secretary position was open for a couple of months. The legislature elected to cover the amount budgeted for ESPA. Lisa Purvis is hired as the temporary secretary.

Gene Hansen presented the Water Master report. In Water District 100, 35 of the 80 wells were measured. He presented what he will be presenting at the annual meeting.

The committee went over the 2008 resolutions. Item #4 b should end after annual meeting, deleting "in accordance with item 7 of these resolutions. Items 5 and 6 minimum charge of \$25 and 5 year average of water usage can be set at annual meeting. On item #9 should read Ernie Carlsen, Wastermaster of 100 not 110. Item #12a and b, take out the "or extensions". The 2008 resolutions were accepted with corrections to present at the annual meeting. John Millar motioned to accept the resolutions with corrections and Guy Erikson seconded the motion.

Ernie brought up that Tim Luke would like to see WD100 expand to include the Rexburg Bench. This could occur sometime next year.

Other Business: The Surface Water Coalition hearing will begin the 16<sup>th</sup> of January, 2008

John Millar motioned to adjourn the meeting. Guy Erikson seconded the motion. The meeting adjourned at 2:30 pm.

### Water District 100 Annual Meeting 2008-2009 Proposed Resolutions

The water users of Water District No. 100 meeting at the annual district meeting on January 28, 200826, 2009, at the Best Western Cottontree Inn, Rexburg Idaho, HEREBY ADOPT THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTIONS:

- 1. That the watermaster perform the duties as required by Chapter 6, Title 42, Idaho Code and in accordance with:
  - 1) The duties described in the Final Order Creating Water District 100, signed by the Director of the Idaho Department of Water Resources (IDWR), December 29, 2006, including:
    - a) Measure, record and report diversions of ground water right included in Water District NO. 100;
    - b) Administer and enforce water rights in Water District No. 100 in priority;
    - c) Curtail unauthorized or excessive diversions in Water District No. 100 (i.e., any diversion without a water right or in excess of the elements or conditions of a water right);
    - d) Curtail out-of-priority diversions under ground water rights in Water District No. 100 determined by the Director to be causing injury to senior priority water rights if not covered by a stipulated agreement or a mitigation plan approved by the Director;
    - e) Enforce the provisions of any stipulated agreements or mitigation plans approved by the Director and applicable in Water District No. 100.
  - 2) Direction and guidance provided by the Director of IDWR pursuant to Idaho Water Law.
  - 3) The annual water district resolutions as adopted herein.
- 2. Ernie Carlsen be elected the watermaster for Water District 100. That the Director of IDWR appoints Ernie Carlsen, an employee of IDWR, to provide watermaster services for the ensuing year.
- 3. As provided in <u>Idaho Code</u> § 42-608(4), the watermaster shall serve until the next annual meeting of the water district after election at this meeting and upon appointment by the Director.
- 4. The water users of Water District No. 100 hereby empower the elected advisory committee to enter into a Memorandum of Understanding between Water District No. 100, and the Director of IDWR that will provide for the following:



WDIDO HOWR will provide compensation of the watermaster for all administrative watermaster duties (all duties other than measurement and reporting) for the term of service as specified in item 3 of these resolutions.

- b) The 2008–2009 budget for Water District No. 100 is limited to expenses related to measurement and reporting, and will be set at this annual meeting.
- c) Water District No. 100 will provide compensation to IDWR for clerical and financial account support services, where such services are related to activities and expenses for measurement and reporting of diversions only.
- d) The watermaster shall maintain an office for the ensuing year within the IDWR Eastern Regional Office, located in Idaho Falls, Idaho.
- e) IDWR will provide office space, vehicles and the use of all necessary office and field equipment in exchange for compensation as set in the budget for the ensuing year. This arrangement shall not give Water District No. 100 any ownership interest in any IDWR office space and equipment.
- 5. The budget of Water District No. 100 for the fiscal year 2008–2009 beginning February 1, 20082009, and ending on January 31, 20092010, be as follows:

WHEREAS some small diversions would have regular assessments less than the amount required by IDWR to maintain their account,

WHEREAS many of these small diversions are not currently measured by the IDWR, ground water districts, or the irrigation district. and;

WHEREAS measurement of diversions smaller than 0.24 cfs that irrigate 5 or less acres is cost prohibitive and the water use for many of these diversions can be estimated.

BE IT RESOLVED that Water District 100 will have a minimum charge of \$25.

- 6. Diversions in Water District 100 that have a water right diversion rate in excess of 0.24 cfs and/or irrigation of more than five acres shall be measured directly by the water district in the ensuing year and assessed at the following rate;
  - a) \$25 per diversion, and;
  - b) A pro-rata share of the remaining budget based upon a 5-year average of water use.
- 7. All payments for assessments not received by May 1, 2008-2009 shall accrue penalties in the amount of 10% of the charge and interest in the amount of 1% per month, as provided pursuant to Idaho Code Section 42-617.
- 8. Be it also resolved, that the Watermaster is authorized pursuant to Idaho Code Section 42-618, to withhold or suspend deliveries of water to any water users who have not paid their assessment charges by January 1 of the year following the billing date.
- 9. Dale Rockwood Alan Kelsch be elected Water District No. 100 Treasurer. The duties of the treasurer will be to approve the expenses and disburse water district funds, and to prepare or oversee preparation of a written statement of the financial affairs of the district at the end of each fiscal year, in accordance with Idaho Code, Section 42-619. Ernie Carlsen, Watermaster of WD100 will also be designated an authorized signature for banking purposes.
- 10. An advisory committee shall be elected at each regular annual session to represent the interests of the water users and to provide input to the watermaster and the Director of IDWR. The 2008-2009 Water District 100 advisory committee shall consist of an odd number of members with a minimum of three. At least two members shall be water users with irrigation rights and one shall be a water user from municipal, commercial or industrial use.
- 11. That the advisory committee be empowered at the annual water district meeting to appoint a representative to the ESPA Water Districts Advisory Committee as required under Section 42-620, Idaho Code.
- 12. WHEREAS Idaho Code 42-605 provides for voting by water users and election of an advisory committee, the water users of Water District No. 100 hereby resolve that the credentials for voting in any district meeting and for serving on the district advisory committee will be as follows:
  - a) Must be a water user of the district as evidenced by a valid water right.
  - b) Must have paid all assessments owed to the water district.

- 13. The annual Water District No. 100 meeting shall hereafter be held on the last Monday of January of each year unless the Director of IDWR or the Water District No. 100 advisory committee should find it necessary to change the meeting date or unless changed by resolution of the district at any annual meeting.
- 14. Copies of the minutes of the annual meeting, the budget as approved, all resolutions approved, and the report prepared in accordance with Idaho Code § 42-615, shall be filed with the director of the Department of Water Resources in accordance with Idaho Code § 42-617.
- 15. The watermaster of Water District No. 100 shall be responsible for submitting to IDWR annual reports showing water use and such other information that may be deemed necessary by the Director of IDWR in accordance with Idaho Code § 42-606, § 42-708, and § 42-709.
- 16. The watermaster and assistant watermasters are authorized under Idaho Code § 42-1701(5) to make reasonable entry on lands within the district to carry out the duties of the watermaster as instructed by IDWR. These duties include but are not limited to:
  - a) Monitoring diversion and measuring rate and volume of water diverted from ground water and other public water sources.
  - b) Measuring the depth to water in wells.
  - c) Monitoring the place, period, and nature of use of water to identify unauthorized diversion and use and to determine compliance with mitigation provisions required by agreement or order of IDWR.



Re: Summary of WD 100 2009 Activities

In January, Water District advisory and public meetings were conducted. Election of IDWR to contract Watermaster services, and therefore, measuring and reporting, was a part of the annual meetings.

The January, February, and March time frame was spent performing WMIS activities. They include updating water user report information, power utility input, and city reporting. Preparing a 2009 visit list was also accomplished.

On March 25, 2009, the Fuji Sonic Flowmeters located in Eastern Regional Office were taken to Kimberly Idaho for calibrations. Heather Bohac, Blake Jordan, and Denise Kidman participated in the calibration activities. Additionally, on March 26, 2009, after installing a new backup battery in one of the meters, I returned to the Calibration Lab and calibrated a sonic meter.

The week of 4/6/2009 and the week of 4/13/2009, 25 network wells were measured for depth to water and data was entered into the WMIS database.

On April 8, 2009, Ernie Carlsen, Gene Hansen, Heather Bohac, Kenda Jones, and Wendy Murphy attended a Watermaster Training Workshop in Pocatello Idaho. It was a one day event.

The measuring process for the spring and summer began in late April and early May. Because of the residual and stored soil moisture, not many wells used for irrigation were initially used.

On May 27, 2009, Ernie Carlsen, Gene Hansen, Heather Bohac, Kenda Jones, and Wendy Murphy attended a Hydrographers Workshop in Jerome Idaho. It was a one day event.

The first three weeks of June had above normal amounts of rain and not much measuring activity was conducted.

On 7/1/2009, Tim Luke responded to concerns raised by Brian Higgs, concerns about not being able to measure one third of the points of diversion due to the wet spring. Brian Higgs is the measuring and reporting contractor for two ground water districts within WD120. Tim responded stating that he was more concerned about the quality of the measurements and that the one third protocol was sure to be made up in the coming years seasons. The same concern was had for WD100, and as stated, the protocol measurements can be made up in coming years.

At the conclusion of the measuring season, 28 sites were visited. An attempt to visit an additional 12 sites was performed. A normal one third protocol would have been 35 sites visited. The wet spring hampered the ability to conduct the protocol number.

The week of November 2, 2009 and the week of November 9, 2009, 25 network wells were measured for depth to water and data was entered into the WMIS data base.

The November and December months have been spent on WMIS data base cleanup.



An additional 12 attempts were made without a measurement taken. Pump cards were discussed. 17 were sent out, 11 showed good reporting, 2 poor reporting, and 4 no reporting at all. Data needs to be turned in we need to find out why some are not reporting at all. Goals for 2009 are to re-visit and re- measure diversions with questionable data, and to re-visit and re-measure diversions not measured in 2007.

Dale Swensen discussed the 2009 Resolutions. Changes are as follows: #2 Gene Hansen will replace Ernie Carlson as Watermaster for WD100. #9) Alan Kelsch will replace Dale Rockwood as Treasurer. #5) the budget for the upcoming year was discussed and will be \$10,500 for 2009. Gene Hansen discussed the Memorandum of Understanding and the need for this document to be in place. It only needs to be signed once and can be revoked at any time. It outlines the services provided by IDWR to the Water districts and what is expected of both parties.   - 3) The annual water district resolutions as adopted herein.
- 2. Gene Hansen is elected the watermaster for Water District 100. That the Director of IDWR appoints Gene Hansen, an employee of IDWR, to provide watermaster services for the ensuing year.
- 3. As provided in <u>Idaho Code</u> § 42-608(4), the watermaster shall serve until the next annual meeting of the water district after election at this meeting and upon appointment by the Director.
- 4. The water users of Water District No. 100 hereby empower the elected advisory committee to enter into a Memorandum of Understanding between Water District No. 100, and the Director of IDWR that will provide for the following:

- a) The 2009 budget for Water District No. 100 will be set at this annual meeting.
- b) Water District No. 100 will provide compensation to IDWR for clerical and financial account support services, Watermaster services and measuring/reporting services.
- c) The watermaster shall maintain an office for the ensuing year within the IDWR Eastern Regional Office, located in Idaho Falls, Idaho.
- d) IDWR will provide office space, vehicles and the use of all necessary office and field equipment in exchange for compensation as set in the budget for the ensuing year. This arrangement shall not give Water District No. 100 any ownership interest in any IDWR office space and equipment.
- 5. The budget of Water District No. 100 for the fiscal year 2009 beginning February 1, 2009, and ending on January 31, 2010, be as follows:

WHEREAS some small diversions would have regular assessments less than the amount required by IDWR to maintain their account,

WHEREAS many of these small diversions are not currently measured by the IDWR, ground water districts, or the irrigation district. and;

WHEREAS measurement of diversions smaller than 0.24 cfs that irrigate 5 or less acres is cost prohibitive and the water use for many of these diversions can be estimated.

BE IT RESOLVED that Water District 100 will have a minimum charge of \$25.

- 6. Diversions in Water District 100 that have a water right diversion rate in excess of 0.24 cfs and/or irrigation of more than five acres shall be measured directly by the water district in the ensuing year and assessed at the following rate;
  - a) \$25 per diversion, and;

- b) A pro-rata share of the remaining budget based upon a 5-year average of water use.
- 7. All payments for assessments not received by May 1, 2009 shall accrue penalties in the amount of 10% of the charge and interest in the amount of 1% per month, as provided pursuant to Idaho Code Section 42-617.
- 8. Be it also resolved, that the Watermaster is authorized pursuant to Idaho Code Section 42-618, to withhold or suspend deliveries of water to any water users who have not paid their assessment charges by January 1 of the year following the billing date.
- 9. Alan Kelsch is elected Water District No. 100 Treasurer. The duties of the treasurer will be to approve the expenses and disburse water district funds, and to prepare or oversee preparation of a written statement of the financial affairs of the district at the end of each fiscal year, in accordance with Idaho Code, Section 42-619. Gene Hansen, Watermaster of WD100 will also be designated an authorized signature for banking purposes.
- 10. An advisory committee shall be elected at each regular annual session to represent the interests of the water users and to provide input to the watermaster and the Director of IDWR. The 2009 Water District 100 advisory committee shall consist of an odd number of members with a minimum of three. At least two members shall be water users with irrigation rights and one shall be a water user from municipal, commercial or industrial use.
- 11. That the advisory committee be empowered at the annual water district meeting to appoint a representative to the ESPA Water Districts Advisory Committee as required under Section 42-620, Idaho Code.
- 12. WHEREAS Idaho Code 42-605 provides for voting by water users and election of an advisory committee, the water users of Water District No. 100 hereby resolve that the credentials for voting in any district meeting and for serving on the district advisory committee will be as follows:
  - a) Must be a water user of the district as evidenced by a valid water right.
  - b) Must have paid all assessments owed to the water district.
- 13. The annual Water District No. 100 meeting shall hereafter be held on the last Monday of January of each year unless the Director of IDWR or the Water District No. 100 advisory committee should find it necessary to change the meeting date or unless changed by resolution of the district at any annual meeting.

- 14. Copies of the minutes of the annual meeting, the budget as approved, all resolutions approved, and the report prepared in accordance with Idaho Code § 42-615, shall be filed with the director of the Department of Water Resources in accordance with Idaho Code § 42-617.
- 15. The watermaster of Water District No. 100 shall be responsible for submitting to IDWR annual reports showing water use and such other information that may be deemed necessary by the Director of IDWR in accordance with Idaho Code § 42-606, § 42-708, and § 42-709.
- 16. The watermaster and assistant watermasters are authorized under Idaho Code § 42-1701(5) to make reasonable entry on lands within the district to carry out the duties of the watermaster as instructed by IDWR. These duties include but are not limited to:
  - a) Monitoring diversion and measuring rate and volume of water diverted from ground water and other public water sources.
  - b) Measuring the depth to water in wells.
  - c) Monitoring the place, period, and nature of use of water to identify unauthorized diversion and use and to determine compliance with mitigation provisions required by agreement or order of IDWR.

#### MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

This memorandum of understanding is entered into by and between the Director of the Department of Water Resources, (hereinafter called the Director) and the water users of Water District No. 100, St Anthony - Rexburg, (hereinafter called Water District No. 100) acting through the Water District Advisory Committee.

WHEREAS, the statutes of the State of Idaho provide for the Director to have direction and control of the distribution of the waters of the state to those holding valid rights to the use thereto; and

WHEREAS, the Water District No. 100 authorized the Advisory Committee, as advisors to, and elected representatives of the water district, by resolution duly adopted at the January 28, 2008, annual meeting of the water users of the district to enter this memorandum of understanding continuing a cooperative program with the Director to provide watermaster services for Water District No.100; and

WHEREAS, the Advisory Committee will, among other things, serve as advisors to the Director and the watermaster in matters relating to the administration and regulation of water rights, and measurement and reporting of water use within the district:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Director agrees to provide the following services to Water District No. 100, effective upon the execution of this memorandum of understanding and to continue to provide the services from year-to-year as herein provided upon election of an employee of the Department as watermaster and the adoption of a budget by the water users at the annual water district meeting authorizing expenditures in accordance with the purposes of this memorandum of understanding:

- 1) To provide watermaster services to Water District No.100, as described in the adopted resolutions for Water District No. 100 for the period from the effective date of this memorandum until the end of any subsequent water district year as agreed to by the water users of Water District No. 100 at their annual meeting and the director of the Department. The adopted resolutions for Water District No. 100 is attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference. Such watermaster services will be provided under the direction of the Director, in coordination with the regional manager of the Department's Eastern Region consistent with the provisions of Title 42, Idaho Code.
- 2) To provide any full time or part time employees as necessary for the water distribution operations of Water District No. 100 in accordance with its adopted budget.
- 3) To provide office space as necessary for operation of Water District No. 100 and to provide Department vehicles for use by full-time employees of the Department, to conduct Water District business, and to share the use of other Department equipment and facilities as are necessary to equitably administer, monitor, regulate and distribute the waters to the users within Water District No. 100.

### WATER DISTRICT NO. 100 agrees as follows:

1) To pay the Department, in accordance with resolutions adopted at the annual water district meeting, sufficient funds to cover the costs of operations incurred in providing watermaster services to Water District No. 100 provided, however, that reimbursement for the watermaster shall not exceed the personnel costs and other costs incurred in conducting Water District No. 100 business and watermaster services. Indirect costs will be paid at the rate approved by the Department of the Interior Inspector General and current at the time of the water district annual meeting.

### THE PARTIES mutually agree that:

- 1) Any person directly employed by the Department as a classified state employee, performing duties on behalf of Water District No. 100 under this memorandum, will only perform those duties as described in the adopted resolutions of Water District No. 100.
- 2) The director of the Department, or an employee(s) designated by the Director, and the chairman of the Advisory Committee shall consult annually prior to the end of the water district's fiscal year concerning the continuation of this memorandum and any need for modification of it.
- 3) This memorandum of understanding will continue from year to year and can be amended or terminated at any time by agreement of the director of the Department and Water District No. 100, on the recommendation of the Advisory Committee.
- 4) Nothing in this agreement will act to change, modify or release either party of any obligation or responsibility otherwise provided by contract or by law.

# Water District 100 Advisory Board Meeting Fremont-Madison Irrigation District 01/14/2009

Dale Swensen called the meeting to order at 1:15 pm. Those in attendance were, Ernie Carlsen (IDWR), Gene Hansen (IDWR), Wendy Murphy (IDWR), Dale Swensen (Fremont-Madison Irrigation District), Kenda Jones (IDWR), Heather Bohac (IDWR).

Minutes were read by Kenda Jones. A correction was made to John Millar's name. Dale Swensen moved to accept minutes, Ernie Carlsen seconded the motion and the minutes were passed.

Wendy Murphy presented the financial report. The Profit/Loss statement shows total income reported from 02/08-01/09 as \$5934. Assessments income was \$5869, \$260 above the budget of \$5600. Total expenses for the year were \$7273. This is over the budget of 5600.00 by \$1673. Net income is -1338.67. Balance sheet shows a bank balance of \$12,317. The Accounts payable balance is \$270. Accounts receivable were \$-988.68. Total liabilities and equities is \$11,328.98. A/R summary shows there are three people with outstanding balances.

Ernie Carlsen then suggested changes to the resolutions. He first suggested Gene Hansen serve as Watermaster for the year 2009, as he is the most familiar with the area and handles most customers in this area. Ernie discussed the "Memorandum of Understanding" document and the need for this contract to be in place. This can be approved at the WD100 annual meeting. Ernie talked about the budget for 2009. becoming part of WD100 was discussed and Gene relayed there are certain issues keeping that from taking place at this time.

Heather Bohac reviewed a Pilot Project that is taking place at Egin Lake that involves replenishing the Snake River Aquifer. This is a pilot project and seems to be showing positive results to date.

#### MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

This memorandum of understanding is entered into by and between the Director of the Department of Water Resources, (hereinafter called the Director) and the water users of Water District No. 100, St Anthony - Rexburg, (hereinafter called Water District No. 100) acting through the Water District Advisory Committee.

WHEREAS, the statutes of the State of Idaho provide for the Director to have direction and control of the distribution of the waters of the state to those holding valid rights to the use thereto; and

WHEREAS, the Water District No. 100 authorized the Advisory Committee, as advisors to, and elected representatives of the water district, by resolution duly adopted at the January 28, 2008, annual meeting of the water users of the district to enter this memorandum of understanding continuing a cooperative program with the Director to provide watermaster services for Water District No.100; and

WHEREAS, the Advisory Committee will, among other things, serve as advisors to the Director and the watermaster in matters relating to the administration and regulation of water rights, and measurement and reporting of water use within the district:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Director agrees to provide the following services to Water District No. 100, effective upon the execution of this memorandum of understanding and to continue to provide the services from year-to-year as herein provided upon election of an employee of the Department as watermaster and the adoption of a budget by the water users at the annual water district meeting authorizing expenditures in accordance with the purposes of this memorandum of understanding:

- 1) To provide watermaster services to Water District No.100, as described in the adopted resolutions for Water District No. 100 for the period from the effective date of this memorandum until the end of any subsequent water district year as agreed to by the water users of Water District No. 100 at their annual meeting and the director of the Department. The adopted resolutions for Water District No. 100 is attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference. Such watermaster services will be provided under the direction of the Director, in coordination with the regional manager of the Department's Eastern Region consistent with the provisions of Title 42, Idaho Code.
- 2) To provide any full time or part time employees as necessary for the water distribution operations of Water District No. 100 in accordance with its adopted budget.
- 3) To provide office space as necessary for operation of Water District No. 100 and to provide Department vehicles for use by full-time employees of the Department, to conduct Water District business, and to share the use of other Department equipment and facilities as are necessary to equitably administer, monitor, regulate and distribute the waters to the users within Water District No. 100.

#### WATER DISTRICT NO. 100 agrees as follows:

1) To pay the Department, in accordance with resolutions adopted at the annual water district meeting, sufficient funds to cover the costs of operations incurred in providing watermaster services to Water District No. 100 provided, however, that reimbursement for the watermaster shall not exceed the personnel costs and other costs incurred in conducting Water District No. 100 business and watermaster services. Indirect costs will be paid at the rate approved by the Department of the Interior Inspector General and current at the time of the water district annual meeting.

#### THE PARTIES mutually agree that:

- 1) Any person directly employed by the Department as a classified state employee, performing duties on behalf of Water District No. 100 under this memorandum, will only perform those duties as described in the adopted resolutions of Water District No. 100.
- 2) The director of the Department, or an employee(s) designated by the Director, and the chairman of the Advisory Committee shall consult annually prior to the end of the water district's fiscal year concerning the continuation of this memorandum and any need for modification of it.
- 3) This memorandum of understanding will continue from year to year and can be amended or terminated at any time by agreement of the director of the Department and Water District No. 100, on the recommendation of the Advisory Committee.
- 4) Nothing in this agreement will act to change, modify or release either party of any obligation or responsibility otherwise provided by contract or by law.

Water District 100 Annual Meeting January 28, 2008

Goals for 2008 are to re-visit and re-measure questionable measurements.

Curtis Parkerson will replace Rich Crapo since he (Curtis) is doing the same thing at Sun Glow. John Millar motioned to adjourn the meeting and Rich Crapo seconded the motion. The meeting adjoined at 3:11 pm.

## Water District 100 Annual Meeting 2008-2009 Proposed Resolutions

The water users of Water District No. 100 meeting at the annual district meeting on January 28, 200826, 2009, at the Best Western Cottontree Inn, Rexburg Idaho, HEREBY ADOPT THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTIONS:

- 1. That the watermaster perform the duties as required by Chapter 6, Title 42, Idaho Code and in accordance with:
  - 1) The duties described in the Final Order Creating Water District 100, signed by the Director of the Idaho Department of Water Resources (IDWR), December 29, 2006, including:
    - a) Measure, record and report diversions of ground water right included in Water District NO. 100;
    - b) Administer and enforce water rights in Water District No. 100 in priority;
    - c) Curtail unauthorized or excessive diversions in Water District No. 100 (i.e., any diversion without a water right or in excess of the elements or conditions of a water right);
    - d) Curtail out-of-priority diversions under ground water rights in Water District No. 100 determined by the Director to be causing injury to senior priority water rights if not covered by a stipulated agreement or a mitigation plan approved by the Director;
    - e) Enforce the provisions of any stipulated agreements or mitigation plans approved by the Director and applicable in Water District No. 100.
  - 2) Direction and guidance provided by the Director of IDWR pursuant to Idaho Water Law.
  - 3) The annual water district resolutions as adopted herein.
- 2. <u>Ernie CarlsenGene Hansen</u> is elected the watermaster for Water District 100. That the Director of IDWR appoints <u>Ernie CarlsenGene Hansen</u>, an employee of IDWR, to provide watermaster services for the ensuing year.
- 3. As provided in <u>Idaho Code</u> § 42-608(4), the watermaster shall serve until the next annual meeting of the water district after election at this meeting and upon appointment by the Director.
- 4. The water users of Water District No. 100 hereby empower the elected advisory committee to enter into a Memorandum of Understanding between Water District No. 100, and the Director of IDWR that will provide for the following:

- a)IDWR will provide compensation of the watermaster for all administrative watermaster duties (all duties other than measurement and reporting) for the term of service as specified in item 3 of these resolutions.
- <u>b)a)</u> The 2008–2009 budget for Water District No. 100 is limited to expenses related to measurement and reporting, and will be set at this annual meeting.
- <u>e)b)</u> Water District No. 100 will provide compensation to IDWR for clerical and financial account support services, where such services are related to activities and expenses for measurement and reporting of diversions only. Watermaster services and measuring/reporting services.
- d)c) The w-watermaster shall maintain an office for the ensuing year within the IDWR Eastern Regional Office, located in Idaho Falls, Idaho.
- e)d) IDWR will provide office space, vehicles and the use of all necessary office and field equipment in exchange for compensation as set in the budget for the ensuing year. This arrangement shall not give Water District No. 100 any ownership interest in any IDWR office space and equipment.
- 5. The budget of Water District No. 100 for the fiscal year 2008–2009 beginning February 1, 20082009, and ending on January 31, 20092010, be as follows:



## Snowpack is Half of Average

The Natural Resources Conservation Service December snow survey shows current snowpacks in Idaho are 45-80 percent of average but only 20-30 percent of their seasonal peaks, which occur in early April.

Snow surveys are conducted at the end of each month from December through May to make snow runoff predictions and water supply forecasts used in managing Idaho's water resources.

"Don't be tricked by December's cold temperatures," said Ron Abramovich, NRCS Water Supply specialist. "Those cold temperatures were accompanied by below normal

precipitation. Currently, the snow-packs across the state are shallow."

November, December and January are generally Idaho's biggest precipitation months, but November and December did not come through. November precipitation amounts were only 20-30 percent of average across southern Idaho and 40-60 percent in central and northern Idaho. December temperatures set record lows at many of Idaho's SNOTEL sites; precipitation ranged from 45 percent of average to near average.

"With more than half the winter still to come, the water supply picture will hopefully improve," added Abramovich. "Above average precipitation will be needed for the next three months to reach average snow water content amounts in the mountains by April,"

The highest snowpacks are 75-80 percent of average in the Panhandle region and the Weiser, Owyhee and Oakley basins. The lowest snowpacks are 45-55 percent of average in the Little Wood, Willow, Blackfoot, Portneuf and Bear basins, as well as the critical Snake River Basin above Palisades Reservoir. Elsewhere, snowpacks are 58-68 percent of average.
