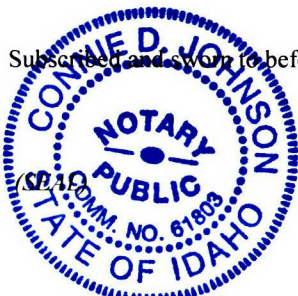

During the 1993 legislative session, the legislature enacted a new law which amends Section 42-619(9), Idaho Code and removes the independent financial audit requirement for most state water districts. The new law, referenced by Section 67-450B, Idaho Code (copy enclosed) identifies minimum audit requirements for all local government entities. Under the new statute, the governing body of any local government entity (i.e.; water district) whose annual budget does not exceed one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) has no minimum audit requirements under this section. This means that any district which handles its own money and whose budget is one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) or less does not have to have an independent public account firm conduct a financial audit every few years as previously required by Section 42-619(9).





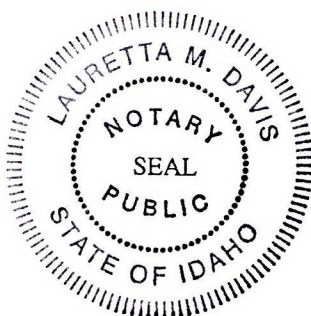

RESOLUTIONS PERTAINING TO THE TIME AND MANNER OF COLLECTING THE BUDGET AS
ADOPTED AT THE ANNUAL MEETING OF THE USERS OF

WATER DISTRICT No. 29-B

It was agreed at the users meeting that the Secretary/Treasurer would design an invoice to be sent to all users and water right holders to collect the necessary revenue. The collection would be based on the following:

1. All water right holders would be assessed a \$25 fee per right for use in maintaining the system. This fee is set by and goes to The Garden Creek Irrigation Company, Inc. It is included here for convenience.
2. All users would be billed \$8/stream/day for their use. This will pay the Watermaster and the admin costs. The billing for 2018 is based on 2017 useage.
3. The \$300 Worker's Comp premium would be billed equally to all water right holders. This calculates out to be \$10.75 per each holder,

Call to Order: President Sheldon Hatley called the meeting to order at 7:07 PM. He asked that Theron (Sec/Treas) conduct the meeting.

Members Present: It was a light attendance with only six members present. They were: Sheldon Hatley, Wendall Marley, Theron Toler, Klain Christensen, Doug Armstrong, and Morgan Ercanbrack.

Last Year's Minutes: Theron read the minutes from last year's meeting. There were no suggested changes. Wendall made the motion that the minutes be accepted as read. Klain seconded. Motion carried.

Old and New Legislation: Theron reviewed briefly the purpose of the meeting as outlined in Section 42-605, Idaho Code. He also pointed out that proxy voting is not allowed at this meeting. Further, because of our small size, an outside audit is not required of our financial records and we are allowed to manage our own finances as long as we do it judiciously. However, we do need to take advantage of some new legislation and move our meeting day to something other than Monday night. We live a community where many people are members of the LDS Church. For many years the Church has asked that other organizations not schedule meetings or activities on Monday night so as to allow families to have Family Home Evening. After some discussion, it was decided to move our meeting to the first Thursday in March. Wendall made a motion to that affect. Sheldon seconded. Motion carried.

Financial Report: Theron presented the attached financial report for the year 2017 and explained it. Wendall made a motion to accept the financial report. Morgan seconded. Motion carried.

Pool and Rotate: There is never enough water in Garden Creek for all users to use it at once, or to just use it arbitrarily. It was suggested that as in years past the water be pooled at rotated on turns or as directed by the Water Master. This method seems to provide the most beneficial use of the water. Wendall made a motion to "pool and rotate" as in years past. Morgan seconded. Motion carried.

Water Master's Compensation, Adopt Budget, and Collect Revenue: Theron reviewed the historical rates and methods used. The district's main expenses are the Water Master's compensation and Worker's Compensation insurance. We have been paying the Water Master \$7/stream/day and charging the users \$8/stream/day. While this covers the Water Master's compensation, the insurance premium is not covered. Theron showed two examples of how this arithmetic does not work out and there will always be a deficit as the revenue generated will not cover all the expected expenses. Much discussion followed with many questions being

asked and many suggestions being made. It was finally agreed that the Water Master's compensation would be left at \$7/stream/day with a user's fee of \$8/stream/day. This allows a margin of \$1/stream/day for miscellaneous administrative expenses. The Worker's Compensation premium would be collected by spreading the cost equally among the 28 listed authorized users of the irrigation system. This would amount to a flat fee of \$10.75 per user. Collection of these monies would be through the use of a district invoice sent to all users. Theron presented and explained an example of an invoice that could be used. Doug made a motion to implement these changes. Wendall seconded. Motion carried.

Old Business: Questions from last year were discussed.

- Wendall to check with Brigham to see if he made culvert guards
- Decreed water rights do not grant free floating water use, they have two anchors: They must have a designated point of diversion as to where the water is taken out of the natural channel, and a designated point of use as to what piece of land the water is to be used on.
- These anchors can be changed to different locations by working with the Department of Water resources. The water rights are not forever attached to the same piece of property as some have thought in the past.
- Decreed water rights have been decreed by a court and remain valid until cancelled by a court. Therefore, the district must treat all water rights on the comprehensive list, which is obtainable from the department, as valid irregardless of their historical status. This means all listed water rights need to be assessed and billed.
- If owners and users of water rights do not pay the assessed fees, then no water is delivered against that right until back payment has been made. If ownership of the water right changes, the delinquent fees follow it and they become the responsibility of the new owner.

Election of Officers: Current officers are: Sheldon Hatley, President; Wendall Marley, Vice President; and, Theron Toler, Secretary/Treasurer. Klain made the motion to keep the officers the same. Wendall seconded. Motion carried.

Advisory Committee: The current advisory committee consists of the elected officers plus the water master, which in our case is also one of the officers. Wendall made the motion to leave the advisory committee the same. Sheldon seconded. Motion carried.

Election of Water Master: Doug made the motion to re-elect Wendall as the Water Master. Klain seconded. Motion carried.

Call for New Business: There was none.

Adjournment: At 8:45 PM Doug made the motion to adjourn. Wendall seconded. Motion carried.

2. Petition for Watermaster's Services. I have sent the Watermaster's Oath to Wendall for him to sign, have notarized, and mail to you.
3. Adopted Budget and Resolutions. The form for the distribution of the budget didn't seem to work well for our situation, so I just wrote a narrative and tried to explain what we do. The same for the collection of the revenue. Hopefully that will be sufficient. This is also explained in the meeting minutes.
4. A copy of the meeting minutes showing the discussions and agreements, or resolutions, we came to. Also, a copy of the 2017 financial report is attached.

Although we have a small operation, it sometime confuses people because of the existence of The Garden Creek Irrigation Company (affectionately known as The Old Ditch Company). If you have any question about how we operate, please do not hesitate to give me a call and I'll try to explain it. However, it wouldn't surprise me to learn that you have other districts far more complex than ours.

I appreciate the work you folks do and it is my desire to keep District 29-B in good standing with your organization. So, if we are out of bounds anywhere please let me know. All of us in the District appreciate being able to operate by ourselves as our own District.
