Enclosed are daily data and calculations for recharge at Sandy Ponds during 2018. SCADA data for the pond's W-26 inflow weir show that inflow to Sandy Ponds began on April 7 and continued through October 21, totaling 9149 acre-feet.

Outflows from the ponds include 1) Morris's pond pump measured with a magnetic flowmeter, 2) Morris's pond overflow weir, 3) flow into the Sandy Pipe Vault measured with an ultrasonic meter, 4) evaporation estimated based on average ETIdaho2017 information, and 5) recharge to the aquifer.

Morris's pond pump's magnetic flowmeter indicated an annual volume of 224.9 acre-feet. SCADA readings for this site indicated an annual volume of 113.0 acre-feet. The cause of this discrepancy between flowmeter volume and SCADA data is unclear; the direct flowmeter readings are used for this report.

Total recorded SCADA volume of the Morris Pond Overflow Weir is 36.3 acre-feet. However, we believe this value is inaccurate. Butch Morris reported to me several times during 2018 that no flow was spilling through the overflow while the SCADA system indicated flows. Butch also reported to me on January 8, 2019 that to his knowledge, spill over the Morris Pond Overflow Weir only occurred once during 2018 with flow of about 100 gpm for a short period. We suspect the level sensor is providing erroneous readings and plans are in place to have it serviced or replaced in early 2019. The actual overflow volume is likely much less than 36.3 acre-feet, but this value is maintained for recharge calculations.

The ultrasonic flowmeter installed on the Sandy Pipe Outflow (inflow to the Vault) indicated a year-end total volume of 1126.3 acre-feet. The raw SCADA data for this meter indicates a total annual volume of 1494 acre-feet. Corbin Knowles updated the ultrasonic flowmeter's low-flow cutoff in early 2018 in an effort to address the erroneous readings apparent in 2017. The flowmeter does not totalize flow during an "Empty Pipe" event, but may still indicate a flow that the SCADA system uses for totalizing in the logger record. During 2018, identical daily flows were reported on the SCADA record for multiple consecutive days, particularly from 9/17 to 10/23 when a constant flow of 2.96 cfs was logged. Butch Morris confirmed that Sandy

Pipeline flow was shut off on or about 9/17, and therefore these flows are erroneous. The Sandy Pipe flowmeter volume of 1126.3 acre-feet is used for recharge calculations.

Flowmeters indicated 670.9 acre-feet were pumped from the vault (see table below) and zero flow was directed into the vault from the Farmers Box. Spill from the vault to Curren Ditch is the difference between Sandy Pipe inflow and Farmers Box inflow, less pumping: 1126.3 + 0.0 - 670.9 = 455.5 acre-feet.

Butch Morris confirmed during a phone call on January 8, 2019 that zero flow for the Morris Vault Pump and the Farmers Box Inflow for 2018 are both correct.

Evaporation from the ponds is calculated based on ETIdaho's Hagerman station for 238 days (April 7 through November 30) for the full 44-acre surface area and totals 118.1 acre-feet.

(1-3) Call to Order, Meeting Chairman Election & Welcome

Frank Erwin, 36A Water Master, opened the meeting at 1:30 pm and introduced IDWR Staff from the Twin Falls office (Nathan Erickson, Corey Skinner). Frank asked for nominations for a meeting Chairman. **Bud Huntly nominated and David Cropper seconded Gary Lemmon as meeting Chair.** No other nominations were received and nominations were closed. **Gary Lemmon was elected Meeting Chair by hand vote with none opposed.**

Handouts available at the sign in sheet included: Agenda for today's meeting, Minutes from the January 17, 2017 Annual Meeting, the 2017 Treasurer's Report and Proposed 2018 Water District Budget, and the proposed 2018 Resolutions. Forty people were in attendance representing 25 of the 69 assessed diversions in the District.

(4) Approval of FY 2017 Annual Meeting Minutes

A motion was made by Bill Jones and seconded by Rudy Shokal to approve the minutes from the January 17, 2017 Annual Meeting as written and presented. Motion carried by voice vote, with none opposed.

(5) Adoption of 2018 Resolutions

Gary Lemmon reviewed the handout titled *Water District 36A - Proposed Resolutions for 2018* which described the rules under which the District operates annually. Gary explained that proposed **resolutions #1-9** & 11 were essentially the same as last year – only the years were updated.

Gary explained that Frank had proposed increasing the annual minimum assessment from \$50 to \$100 (resolution #10). Frank explained that the proposed increase was partially to offset increasing costs to administer water to smaller diversions and partly to be fairer to all diverters.

Frank explained that new **resolution #12** described how "winter water" rights were to be administered and assessed. The resolution detailed (a) what beneficial uses were involved, (b) how to accomplish the diversions, and (c) how to assess those diversions without adding costs to other water users in the district. Frank explained that some of the private water rights were already being delivered by ditch companies and that others were outside organized ditch company service areas. Nathan Erickson, IDWR, commented that winter water diversions delivered by ditch companies were already contributing toward District assessments as part of their ditch company annual assessments. Frank explained that this resolution would require combining the winter water rights, whether originally located in or outside ditch company service areas, into a common assessment category separate from the ditch companies.

Comments on Resolution #12:

A winter water right user asked why a diversion not being delivered by a ditch company would need to be administered under the new resolution #12 when the two users using that particular source got along well without disputes. Frank explained that because one winter water user within the District boundaries had already called for his water, all water users would have to be administered.

Bud Huntley of Big Bend Ditch asked about fees for wheeling water. Frank explained that the District assessment to cover his Water Master services for administration of the winter water rights would be in addition to any assessment levied by the ditch company for maintenance and/or delivery. Asked for an estimate of the total cost, Frank estimated about \$1.00/24-hr cubic ft per second (or per 2 acre feet). Butch Morris projected about \$2,000 annually to be split among the winter water users. Frank also discussed the need to measure water after it leaves the fish hatchery and goes under HWY 30 to the other uses. Installation fees would have to be billed to Big Bend members.

Frank explained the overall purpose of this resolution will be to regulate the annual storage volume limitation of each water right. The most extreme example in the District is a water right volume that would be fulfilled 4 hr and 17 minutes after starting the diversion. Each year the water user must decide over what time period he wants to divert that volume. Another administration difficulty is that many of the winter rights were not adjudicated with an additional carrying volume. Frank also cautioned the road to the diversional carrying volume.

John Mavencamp moved and Butch Morris seconded that the 2018 proposed resolutions be adopted as written. There was no further discussion. Motion carried by voice vote, with none opposed.

(6) Adoption of Proposed 2018 Budget

Frank Erwin reviewed the handout titled *Water District 36A Budget Summary (as of 12/31/17)* which included both the 2017 Treasurer's Report (adopted and actual budgets) and the 2018 Proposed Budget. He explained that the assessment rate of \$ 0.050/24-hr second ft was the same as last year and that the budget included the increased minimum fee adopted by resolution. Additional funds generated would be put toward Water Master and Secretary wages.

A motion to accept the proposed budget as presented was made by David Cropper and seconded by Rudy Shokal. There was no further discussion. Motion carried by voice vote, with none opposed.

(7) Election of Water District 36A Advisory Board for FY 2018

Gary Lemmon explained that there was no minimum/maximum number of people that could be on the board and that the current board members represented a majority of the beneficial uses in the district, including winter water rights and the State (eg. IDFG). Gary Lemmon asked for nominations from the floor.

Peggy Candy moved and Bud Huntley seconded that the Advisory Board members who served in 2017 be re-elected to serve in 2018. No other nominations were offered and the nominations were closed. Motion passed by voice vote, with none opposed.

(8-9) Water Master's Report & Goals for 2018

Frank reported that his main goal for 2018 will be winter water right accounting/scheduling for 2019. Frank also expressed his disappointment that other diverters were not signing or filling out annual flow reports completely. He also wanted diverters using meters to supply serial numbers annually. He reminded open channel diverters to record flow measurements weekly not monthly.

Frank reported that, in general, Billingsley Creek flow had improved this past year by as much as 5-7 cfs. He attributed this to a combination of recharge on the ESPA plain, positive hydrostatic pressure from water in the W-canal on the rim, and to the number of deep well conversions near the rim that substituted canal water for pumped well water.

Meeting adjourned at 2:15 pm.

By November 1st, the Lateral Manager of the canal or ditch company must approve all deliveries requested and submit to the Water Master of WD 36A, on a form supplied by the Water Master, the approved schedule detailing the delivery of all water rights subject to the beneficial uses described above. Also by November 1st, all water right owners of water rights with the beneficial uses listed above but not delivered through a canal or ditch company shall provide the Water Master of WD 36A, on a form approved by the Water Master of WD 36A, the schedule of the dates for rate of flow to fill the annual diversion limit on the water right for the following year. Water will be delivered on a weekly basis and flow rates will be adjusted weekly.

Any request for water delivery not approved by the Lateral Manager and Water Master of WD36A will not be delivered.

Assessments for delivery of these water rights will be based on the most recent reliable data available to the Water Master. However, assessments for 2019 will be based on an estimate determined by the Water Master using the approved flow requests and schedules submitted by the aforementioned dates in 2018.



Tom Van Tassel moved and Bill Jones seconded that the 2017 proposed resolutions be adopted as written. There was no further discussion. Motion carried by voice vote, with none opposed.

(7) Water Master's Report & Goals for 2017

Frank reported that he had no complaints about measuring and reporting efforts by District members. He reminded everyone with meters to make sure that they included all of the basic information requested on the report form specific to their particular meter (serial numbers, multiplier, etc) as he was compiling a book summarizing that information for a new water master to use in the future. He had already compiled a book with pertinent information on the open channel diversions in the District. There are still a couple of PCCs in the District that need to be changed over to meters by 2018.

Frank reported, in general, that Billingsley Creek streams were a bit improved this past year. He reported that low elevation springs downstream of Tupper Grade were more steady state than in previous years due in part, he believes, to positive hydrostatic pressure from water in the W-canal on the rim. At the same time, springs upstream of Tupper Grade were not at steady state.

He also reported that the groundwater districts intend to purchase the Rangen Hatchery at the head of Billingsley Creek (upstream of Tupper Grade) this year and are expected to change how they operate the Magic Springs pump that was installed to supply up to 10 cfs spring water as mitigation to that facility. As facility owners, the GW districts will no longer have to supply mitigation water to themselves. Last year about 8 cfs of spring water was delivered to the facility under the mitigation agreement, which was subsequently available for diversion by other users along Billingsley Creek after discharging the facility. Without the Magic Springs water, Curren Ditch diverters immediately downstream of the Rangen facility will be the first users affected whenever the canal company can't deliver substitute wastewater to them through the Sandy Pipeline.

(8) Additional News & Updates

Frank reported that recharge efforts above the rim have been slowly moving forward, but that headway is being made. The goal of 250,000 acre feet of recharge is still a long way off, but more infrastructure is in place to accommodate recharge when available. Freezing weather this winter is hampering recharge efforts through the Milepost 31 site, but Twin Falls Canal Co. did some recharge in Murtaugh Lake.

WATER DISTRICT 36A – ADOPTED RESOLUTIONS FOR 2017

- 1 BE IT RESOLVED, that hereafter the annual meeting of Water District 36A shall be held on the third Tuesday in January each year.
- 2 BE IT RESOLVED, that the amounts payable by each ditch, association, canal company, or other water user, as shown by the approved budget, shall become due and payable upon receipt and delinquent on April 15th, and said amount, if not paid, shall bear a penalty of 10% and interest from that date until paid, at a rate of 1% per month.
- 3 **BE IT RESOLVED**, that no ditch, association, canal company, or other water user shall have the right to demand and receive water, and the Water Master shall not deliver to such person(s) or entity(ies), until the amount due and payable from such user(s), as fixed by the budget, has been paid.
- 4 BE IT RESOLVED, that the Water Master shall be in service for a full year, commencing on February 1st of each year and continuing until the following January 31st, or until his successor as been duly qualified and elected.
- 5 **BE IT RESOLVED**, that Frank Erwin be elected Water Master of Water District 36A for the ensuing year, beginning February 1, 2017, and ending January 31, 2018.
- 6 **BE IT RESOLVED**, that Linda Lemmon be elected Secretary/Treasurer for Water District 36A for the ensuing year, beginning February 1, 2017, and ending January 31, 2018.
- 7 BE IT RESOLVED, that the elected Treasurer of Water District 36A should only disburse monies from the Water District accounts upon a voucher approved by the Water Master. All Water District checks can be signed either by the Treasurer or Chairman, but must be co-signed by an Advisory Board Member. Advisory Board Members Howard Morris and Billy McCarthy shall serve for the purpose of co-signing all Water District 36A checks.
- 8 BE IT RESOLVED, that Water District 36A assessments shown in the adopted budget shall constitute a final determination of the amount due for that year (per Idaho Code 42-612).
- 9 BE IT RESOLVED, that Water District 36A assessments shall be based on the most recent reliable data available to the Water Master and shall be assessed in 24-hour second feet (per Idaho Code 42-612).
- 10 BE IT RESOLVED, that for the year 2017, a minimum charge of \$50.00 shall be assessed to each individual or entity that owns a water right, whose share of the total budget is less than the above specified amount.
- 11 BE IT RESOLVED, that for all mitigation and replacement water rights administered within the boundary of Water District 36A, the Water Master shall require lockable and controllable structures at all points of delivery and measuring devices approved by both the Water District 36A Water Master and IDWR. Costs for structures and devices shall be paid by the owner of the water right being used for mitigation or replacement purposes.
