Dear Mayor Campbell:

I have enclosed a copy of the hydrographs for the Snake River near Lorenzo, Rexburg, and Shelley for the three day period May 21 - May 23. These hydrographs clearly reveal the magnitude of river fluctuations induced by the operation of the City's hydropower facilities. These fluctuations at the Shelley gaging station exceed 1,200 cfs. As I write this letter I am observing the river in the process of being changed by a similar amount.

The Department of Water Resources, canal company and irrigation district representatives, the Committee of Nine, and the watermaster have contacted and met with the City numerous times during the past five years concerning these fluctuations and the associated interference with the delivery of decreed, natural flow, and storage rights. While you have consistently given assurances that the City will operate its facilities responsibly and will not allow associated operations to impact other water users, the fluctuations continue to occur.

Based upon the City's unsuccessful record and the current difficulties local canals are having because of the unpredictable flows below your Gem State facility, it appears that I have no choice but to seek appropriate remedies to assure my ability to properly distribute available water supplies.

I anticipate that on the next occurrence we will immediately commence action pursuant to Chapter 3 of Title 42, Idaho Code which provides for the cancellation of water right permits and licenses. This action will, of course, be independent of possible actions effected irrigation companies might

take in a civil proceedings pursuant to Idaho Code, Section 42-902 which establishes your liability at "three times the actual damage sustained in consequence of any such wrongful act or acts."

One of the major concerns expressed to the Department of Water Resources by those originally objecting to City hydropower projects related to anticipated river fluctuations associated with these projects. The Director was sufficiently satisfied that the City was capable of operating run-of-the-river hydropower facilities without impacting other water users to grant the City permits. The continuing unacceptable performance of the City indicates the Director's conclusions may have been in error. If the City is not capable of operating its hydropower facilities in the manner consistent with pre-construction representations, the error the Department made in granting the City water right permits should be corrected before further injury occurs.





MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE LOWER VALLEY COMMITTEE OF NINE THURSDAY, OCTOBER 27, 1988

Bob Reichert called the meeting of the Lower Valley Committee of Nine representatives to order in the offices of Nelson, Rosholt, Robertson, Tolman & Tucker in Twin Falls, Idaho, at 1:30 p.m. Attached hereto is an agenda of the meeting which was precirculated as well as a list of those persons in attendance. Included were representatives of TFCC, NSCC, AFRD#2, A & B, M.I.D., B.I.D., Falls Irrigation District, Aberdeen-Springfield and the Bureau of Reclamation.

Chairman Reichert first called on Attorney John Rosholt to summarize the activities of TFCC and NSCC in bringing an action to enlarge Water District Ol and for a moratorium as against the groundwater diversions which could impact the flows of the Snake River above Milner. Rosholt also discussed generally the problems that everyone had with water accounting in the summer of 1988 alleging that it appears that the water measurements are being balanced by varying the natural flow to the extent necessary.

Bob Reichert indicated there were some problems that the Lower Valley Representatives had encountered in the past in the operation of the District. The Lower Valley had suggested solutions for some of those problems by recommending quarterly meetings, appropriate notices of meetings and an agenda to accompany each notice of meeting. He indicated that for the most part this had not been accomplished as evidenced by meetings in Jackson Hole and other locations in the recent past.

Chuck Coiner then talked about a proposed study of the Water District operations by the University of Idaho and the Idaho Department of Water Resources that might identify the impacts of additional development within Water District Ol as well as reasons for the fluctuations in natural flow measurements and District Ol accounting. He suggested that Charles Brockway could coordinate such a study. Upon motion by Richard Morris, seconded by Leonard Scheer, it was suggested that the Lower Valley Representatives prepare a resolution to be circulated in advance of the Water District meeting recommending that the Water District finance such a study. motion carried unanimously. The purpose for having the study coordinated by Brockway through the University of Idaho and the Idaho Water Resources Research Institute is so that we could obtain an independent look at the operation of the District.

Jack Eakin then talked about possible accounting methods and the annual District Ol audit. He indicated substantial dissatisfaction amongst those at the annual District meeting. He indicated that in the past the Lower Valley Representatives had proposed a simpler form for the watermaster to present the numbers to both the Committee of Nine and to the annual Water District meeting. There was also discussion that the auditor was employed watermaster as opposed to a committee of the Committee of There was also some discussion that we are operating the District with year old financial data for the reason that the books are not closed until the Water District meeting in March and it is impossible for that reason to have an audit for the Water District meeting until the following March. It was moved by Coiner, seconded by Morris that we ask Jack Eakin to write a letter to the watermaster requesting:

- More simplified fiscal statements.
- 2. That an audit committee of the Committee of Nine select the auditor for the annual audit.
- 3. That a resolution be adopted changing the fiscal year of the District to the calendar year so that audits could be performed after January 1 and be available for the March meeting of the Water District, two months later.

The group then discussed agenda items D and E which deal with the scheduling of meeting dates and advance notice for meetings of the Committee of Nine. It was suggested that Phil Hanks, chairman of the Committee of Nine who was present, could contact the watermaster in this regard and that no formal action or letter would be necessary.

As to agenda No. F, there was a discussion that the assessments and the votes at the annual Water District meeting are not equal. Rosholt suggested that an amendment was agreed to by the Committee of Nine and submitted to the legislature in late 1988, but did not get considered. It was suggested that we ask the Committee of Nine to validate resubmitting amendment to Idaho Code § 42-605 so as to better equalize votes with the assessments paid.

Thereafter, a long discussion ensured concerning agenda item G -- reapportionment of the District for the representatives to the Committee of Nine. This discussion centered around the fact that the Committee of Nine director districts varied between 9.1 percent of the vote and 18.1 percent of the vote. After a long discussion as to the inequitable makeup of the Committee of Nine, it was moved by Coiner, and seconded by Oneida that the firm of Nelson, Rosholt draft and circulate draft legislation which would facilitate

the official formation of a Board of Directors and business organization for large water districts, to be governed by formal articles and bylaws. The motion carried. Rosholt indicated that it was possible that only a brief statutory amendment would be necessary to facilitate the formalization of such an organization.

The group then discussed proposed public relations — attorney representative requested by Ron Carlson. While there was some discussion that a PR person could well enhance the water users' public image, ideas from newsletters to advertising agencies were proposed. Lester Saunders indicated that the Board of Directors of his company were happy with the present attorney arrangement. Some indicated that if the PR effort was needed in the District, that the Committee of Nine should direct the watermaster to carry out that effort and if it meant that he needed to hire additional people, that he get them involved.

There being no further business to come before the meeting, the same was adjourned at approximately 3:45 p.m.
