Chairman Doyle Fackler called the meeting to order.

Minutes:

The August 12, 2013, meeting minutes were presented in written form to all persons in attendance to review. Chairman Fackler asked if there were any additions or corrections; none were noted. **Dennis Lammey moved and Fred Coburn seconded to approve the August 12, 2013, minutes as corrected.** <u>Passed.</u>

Financial:

Chairman Fackler asked Ron to review the financial statement for the district. Ron reported a checking account balance of \$1,873.36 and a balance in the State Treasury Fund of \$1,093,784.43 resulting in a checking and savings total of \$1,095,657.79. Total accounts receivable equaled \$5,963.06. Total fixed assets will remain at \$78,068.37 producing a total assets balance of \$1,179,689.22. Ron then reviewed the profit and loss statement and stated that as of October 14, 2013, the District is showing a net income of \$90,275.94. Chairman Fackler asked if there were any other questions or concerns. **Dennis Lammey moved and Wayne Martin seconded to approve the Financial Statement as presented.** Passed.

IDWR Update:

Due to the holiday, no one from Idaho Department of Water Resources was present at tonight's meeting. Ron included the preliminary Payette River stored water supply. Total storage available as of October 9, 2013, is 895,379af. Total storage used including canals, pumps, endangered species and water passing Letha is 431,836af. Storage based on accounting of 463,543af subtracted from actual reservoir contents of 462,179af result in an averaging error of 1,364af. Also provided was a copy of the Payette River Flow Accounting.

Watermaster

Report:

Ron provided in the packets the reservoir storage reports, snow water equivalent, and the year-to-date precipitation for the Payette Basin. The teacup diagram of the Payette River shows the Payette River system at 52% of capacity with includes Cascade at 54% full and Deadwood Reservoir at 42% of capacity.

A year-to-date report of total diverted volume and remaining available storage for Black Canyon, Farmers Co-op and Emmett Irrigation was provided. Black Canyon has 337,980af diverted and 80,437af remaining; Farmers Co-op has 124,917af diverted and 9,157af remaining and Emmett Irrigation has 140,348af diverted and 22,621af remaining.

Ron presented a few Snotel site charts which demonstrated the total precipitation for the 2013 year to be quite close to normal. The timing of precipitation, and the fact that much of the early water came in the form of rain instead of snow, contributed to a short water year where we relied on much more storage water than normal.

River Pump Accounting:

Ron gave an Internet Data Acquisition and Calculation Demonstration of River Pump Accounting via Idaho Power Load Data. Ron reminded everyone that he had been working with Idaho Power for several years in an attempt to access electric load data for pumps in the Payette River System. He said he was happy to report the power company finally has a product available that is very useful. He gave a demonstration of how the data is presented and how he is able to set up a spread sheet for each account that will translate kilowatt hour usage to flow rate and timing. Ron said he has high hopes for the system.

Reservoir Refill:

A letter from Jerrold Gregg, Bureau of Reclamation, was included in the packet regarding the reduced flows at Deadwood Reservoir. It stated that the Bureau is proposing to reduce the winter stream flows below Deadwood Dam from 50cfs to 2.4cfs starting on September 25, 2013. These changes are being proposed as a result of the preliminary flexibility study finding for Deadwood Reservoir, current drought conditions and the associated volume of Deadwood Reservoir. Reclamation proposes that these interim operational changes be in place for the period of Sept. 25, 2013, to the end of 2014 irrigation releases to validate assumptions, models, and study results. Since this operation could affect the natural flow accounting, it is proposed that any natural flow that is stored in Deadwood Reservoir as a result of this operation, be exchanged from Reclamation's un-contracted account in Lake Cascade. This exchange would be accounted for until the end of the irrigation season.

Cost Share Program:

The 2013 Cost Share Projects have been completed and with the postponed Washoe Irrigation and Enterprise Ditch projects moved to 2014, there is an excess of \$19,972.42 remaining in the budget. Discussion ensued in regards to carrying over those funds to the 2014 projects to help offset those requests. Moved by Ron Mio and seconded by Darlene Maxwell to approve carrying over the excess \$19,972.42 from the 2013 Cost Share Projects to the 2014 Projects. Passed

Nomination and Budget Committee:

Chairman Fackler stated that the Budget and Nominating committee needed to be appointed for the 2014 Annual Meeting. Ron provided a list of the previous committee members and reminded the board of the duties of each committee. The following persons were appointed to serve as both the Budget Committee and the Nominating Committee: Chairman, Dan Surmeier, Dennis Lammey, Jim Standley, Doyle Fackler and Darlene Maxwell. It was decided to hold the committee meeting on Monday, October 28, 2013, at 1pm, in the Emmett Irrigation District's office.

Annual Meeting:

Ron provided two date options to reserve for the 2014 Annual Meeting and asked members if they had any suggestions. Discussion ensued and Ron was directed to reserve the USDA Service Center in Emmett for the 2014 Annual WD #65 and Payette River Water Users Meeting on Wednesday, January 15, 2014. He will confirm that date at the November meeting.

SCADA Radio

System:

Ron reported on the Spread Spectrum SCADA Radio System that was installed by Intermountain Environmental for the Weiser Irrigation District. He said he had a chance to operate the system because he had been asked to upgrade some Datalogger programs for the district. He reported that he was very impressed with the speed of the un-licensed radio system and said it was several times faster than any communication system he had worked with. He stated he has no need for future investment to our licensed radio system since he has sufficient coverage with the existing repeaters. He also reported many canal companies are not interested in the cost free service of the radio system and are making plans to return to cellular phone service.

Adjournment:

Chairman Fackler asked if there was any further business that should be considered at this regular meeting. Hearing none the meeting was adjourned.
