Water District #41 Annual Meeting March 4, 2019

The annual water meeting was held at the Rockland City Building on March 4, 2019 and was called to order by Chairman Brent Walker at 1:05pm. A welcome was extended to all in attendance including Jim Bitzenburg from the Dept. of Water Resources.

Chairman Walker asked that the minutes of the previous meeting be read. A motion was made by James Robinson to approve the minutes as printed and seconded by Kyle Matthews. Motion passed.

Chairman Walker then asked for a motion to elect a Chairman and a Secretary/Treasurer for the upcoming year. A motion to retain Brent Walker as Chairman and Alan Permann as the Secretary/Treasurer was made by Kyle Matthews and seconded by Curtis Munk. Motion passed.

Chairman Walker asked Watermaster Brian Woodworth to report on the previous water year. "The 2018 water year was excellent on the East Fork of Rock Creek. Water users on this diversion had full water rights throughout the watering season with minimal juggling of available stream flow. The south fork of Rock Creek had a tough year maintaining steam flow, much like last year. The Landing ditch never saw much over 5" of water throughout the watering season and dipped to its lowest mid July. Because of its proximity to the south end of the valley, there is no way to gain water even though the users have some of the older rights. Although other ditches with South Fork diversions were subject to cuts, we did see some improvement by the end of August."

Chairman Walker then asked for the financial report including a proposed budget for the coming year. Secretary Permann reported that \$7937.25 was spent the previous budget year out of a budget of \$8,250.00. The checking account has a balance of \$1540.91 as of 3/4/2019. The following proposed budget for 2019 was then discussed.

Motion was made by James Robinson and seconded by Kyle Matthews to accept the application of Brian Woodworth as Watermaster for 2019. Motion passed.

Secretary Permann reported that last year permission was given to move the District's money to another bank to avoid a \$5.00 monthly service charge. That change was made and the District's money and checking account is now being handled by the Bank of Commerce in American Falls, Idaho.

Chairman Walker asked if any problems had been brought to the attention of the Advisory committee. Hearing none, he asked for a motion to retain the same advisory committee as the previous year. A motion was made that Ronald L. Nelson, Rick Nelson and Scott Hendrickson serve as the Advisory Committee for 2019 by James Robinson and seconded by Curtis Munk. Motion passed.

James Robinson made a motion to adjourn the meeting until next year (2020), to be held on the first Monday of March at 1pm, seconded by Kyle Matthews. Motion passed. The meeting was adjourned at 1:30pm.
