**MINUTES OF THE
ANNUAL ROCK CREEK WATER DISTRICT 47-0 MEEING
MARCH 1, 2021**

There was a total of nine in attendance, three people attended in person, at the IDWR office, including one IDWR staff member, and six others joined by way of the zoom connection.

The meeting was called to order by Hal Frazier as acting Chairman for the 2021 annual meeting.

The 2020 minutes were read and approved.

OLD BUSINESS:

The beaver concern was addressed and the Watermaster, Amie Franklin, stated that due to the heavy runoff last year it had displaced a number of the ones that were causing the greatest problems. She also mentioned that the Fish and Game had been contacted and came out to one of the sights where the greatest problem had been in the prior year. Some of the West Ditch users also had watched the beaver activity in the area and discouraged them from continuing to build dams by removing some of material they were bringing in to build with.

There was some discussion concerning the Minimum users that had been mentioned, last year, that seemed to be using water without at right, and those with a right were often using water after they had been told to shut off for the year. A letter had been written, concerning these issues and an IDWR staff member had made a visit or two to one of the users. The problems seemed to be much better later in the summer. The Watermaster stated that she will keep a close eye on the situation this year because of the possibility of a lack of water.

It was also mentioned that a possible raise next year for the minimum users since they do take a quite a bit of the Watermasters' time trying to keep them in compliance.

ELECTION OF WATERMASTER AND SECRETARY/TREASURER:

A motion was made and seconded to retain Amie Franklin as Watermaster and Shari Helman as Secretary/Treasurer. Motion carried unanimously.

BUDGET:

There was a motion and a second to maintain the same wages for the Watermaster, which is \$6,000 per year and Secretary/Treasurer, which is \$650, have the Workers Comp remain at \$525 to cover that premium, and have \$125 set aside for miscellaneous expenses. The entire budget for the year 2021 will remain at \$7300. Motion carried.

ADVISORY BOARD:

There was some discussion concerning the Advisory Board since there has been some changes over the last couple of years. There was a motion made, and a second, to add Matt Nail to be the second advisor on the East Ditch. Motion carried. It was also determined there is no longer a need of an advisor for the expansion area.

The Advisory Board now consists of: Poncho, of the Rock Creek Ranch, East Ditch & Main Creek; Hal Frazier, Minimum users on the Main Creek; David Funk, West Ditch and the newly elected Matt Nail, East Ditch.

WATERMASTER REPORT:

She reported that last year had been, a pretty good year but is fearful that this year may be a very low water year, due to the lack of snow in the mountains.

The East Ditch had been cleaned last year and in good working order; this had been discussed at the last years' meeting.

She encouraged all users to use this next month to make sure all measuring devices are in good working order and ready for a new season.

RESOLUTIONS:

There were no concerns about our resolutions, so all remained the same.

NEW BUSINESS or OTHER CONCERNS:

No one had any new business or concerns at this time.

ADJOURNMENT:

A motion was made and seconded to adjourn the meeting. Motion carried.
