RE: WATER DISTRICT 74-W, TEXAS CREEK

Dear Mr. Clark:

I have reviewed your letter dated August 3, 1990 which you sent in response to my letter of July 27, 1990.

On August 15, 1990, personnel from our Idaho Falls office conducted some measurements and field work on Warm Springs Creek associated with whether water remaining in the creek below the James Whittaker diversion would reach Texas Creek. The conditions which existed at the time the field work was done showed that the 0.96 cfs of water remaining in Warm Springs Creek, below the Whittaker diversion would reach Texas Creek since Warm Springs Creek gains water in its lower reach.

In order to minimize channel losses in Warm Springs Creek and to make efficient use of the available water in the Creek, the department will allow the available water in Warm Springs Creek to be diverted at the Whittaker diversion provided the watermaster credits Texas Creek with water in excess of Whittaker's right. This crediting can be accomplished by shorting one of Whittaker's Texas Creek rights by the amount of Warm Springs Creek water which would reach Texas Creek. This arrangement will provide the same amount of water in Texas Creek to be distributed to those entitled to its use.

The department will continue to supervise and assist the watermaster in the distribution of water in the system. We appreciate your extensive knowledge of the system and plan to be responsive to concerns which you may raise in the future. The watersuers may want to adopt some resolutions at the next water district meeting to document "exchanges" such as this one.

Please feel free to contact our office in Idaho Falls with water distribution questions which may arise.
