Re: Water Supply Bank request for Water District No. 65-K

Dear Mr. Saxton;

After considerable delay we are forwarding information relevant to our request for appointment as a local committee to lease and rent water within the Lake Fork Creek basin. It is unlikely that such services will be required during the coming irrigation season (1997), but we certainly want to be fully functional for the 1998 season.

The information enclosed includes the following:

1. The draft rental pool procedures as changed to reflect our needs.
 - a. On the advice of Mark Limbough a paragraph on leases (5.8) has been added to clarify the procedure for leasing space/water to the District 65 rental pool. Do you think the fee requirement is necessary?
2. Requirements of Rule 40.
 - a. Officers: president, Gary Stiehl; vice president, Jake Maki; secretary Herald Nokes.
 - b. Copies of lease and rental forms to be used by Water District No. 65-K rental pool.
 - c. Determination of priority. The advisory committee felt that priority to lease stored water and to rent stored water should be based on the date of application; first come first served.
 - d. Bylaws and procedures. As far as I know, all procedures of Water District No. 65-K are based on that portion of the Idaho Code covering water districts.

We would very much appreciate your review of the enclosed information and any advice you might have concerning additions or changes. We feel that a local Water Supply Bank would be very helpful in facilitating and insuring the continuing beneficial use of stored water in our district.
