Subject: Cascade Reservoir Space Allocation

Dear Mr. Limbaugh:

The storage space in Cascade Reservoir must be reapportioned to conform to the September 1995 Area and Capacity tables published for the reservoir, and in accordance with the repayment contracts between the Bureau of Reclamation and the various irrigation districts with storage contracts in Cascade Reservoir. The new tables are the result of the resurvey of the reservoir.

The active capacity of the reservoir is the volume between elevation 4787.50 and the full pool elevation of 4,828.00. This volume is now determined to be 636,003 acre feet. This space has been allocated among the various spaceholders, including the uncontracted space, according to the percentages specified in the respective repayment contracts.

A table is enclosed which shows the contract entitlement for each spaceholder, the storage volume of the respective spaceholder under the old area and capacity table, and the revised space apportioned to each spaceholder based on the new area and capacity table.

The active capacity of Cascade Reservoir is 636,003 acre-feet, therefore, the preferred space is 122,303 acre-feet (19.23% x 636,003). The remaining space, 80.77% of the active capacity BOR (Joan group) (513,700 acre-feet), is divided among the other spaceholders, including Reclamation's uncontracted space.

## WATER PRICING COMMITTEE MEETING

A meeting of the Water District Water Pricing Committee was held on October 30, 1996, in the Water District offices in Payette at 7:00 p.m.. Present were members of the committee, Bob Henggeler, Wilbur "Brick" Andrew, and Keith Standley, Mark Limbaugh (Watermaster), and representatives from the U.S. Bureau of Reclamation, Jerry Gregg, Rich Rigby, and Rick Wells.

Mark reviewed the 1996 Rental Pool operations with the group, which is attached to these minutes. The group then reviewed a copy of the amendment to the Water District No. 01 Rental Pool Procedures adopted by the Committee of Nine (attached). Jerry Gregg explained how that amendment and water price was arrived at with Water District 01. In a dry year, it was explained, the price of water would be about \$25 per acre foot, but in a good water year, the value of water would be \$0 per acre foot. The USBR rents about 250,000 acre feet of salmon water from the Upper Snake annually, so it was agreed to set the out of basin price at \$10.50 per acre foot for the next four years, \$7.00 to the Lessor, \$0.75 to the Water District, \$0.70 to the Idaho Water Resource Board, and \$2.05 to be held in trust by the District for the purpose of securing up to 250,000 acre feet of rental water in 1997, 1998, or 1999 if a higher price is required to meet the USBR requirements in one or more of those years. Should these funds not be needed to secure the salmon water for the Bureau, then the funds will revert to the Water District for general improvements of the District, such as stream gaging, automation and hydrologic investigations in Water District 01. In-basin rental is priced at \$2.95 per acre foot, with \$2.00 to the Lessor, \$0.75 to the Water District and \$0.20 to the IDWR Board. Last to fill requirements for any out of basin rentals are still in effect in Water District 01.

It was then brought up that Water District No. 65 was interested in raising the price of water to be rented out of basin from its current level of \$2.70, with a last to fill deposit of an additional \$2.70, which is refunded if the space fills the following year. Jerry asked the group if a level of \$5.40, with no provision for a refund if the space fills, would be a fair price. Jerry and Rich both stated that several factors would have to be addressed before any price was increased. Jerry asked that the District set the price for water as follows, to equal the \$5.40 per acre foot:

Price to Lessor	\$4.23/AF
WD65 Admin. Fee	.75/AF
IDWR Board Surcharge	.42/AF

Total Price

\$5.40/AF

Other considerations which need to be addressed were a change in the priority among lessors date, as well as a change in the priority of rental dates. Under Para 6.2 of the WD65 Rental Pool Procedures, the new date for priority leases would be June 1, instead of July 1 as the rules currently read. This means that water leased to the rental pool prior to June 1<sup>st</sup> would be rented first, and the lessors would share proportionally in the proceeds of those rentals. Any water leased to the pool after June 1<sup>st</sup> would be rented on a first come basis. As for changes in the priority of renters dates, under Para 7.2 of the Procedures, the date of July 1 for agricultural preference would remain the same; however, under Para 7.3, the July 15 date for other irrigation renters would change to July 1. This means that priority of rental would be given to all in-basin agricultural irrigation renters who paid for water prior to July 1, and after July 1, storage water could be rented out of basin on a first come basis, if the lessor so desired. It was discussed that in-basin rental prices might be set at \$2.95 per acre foot, identical to Water District 01.

Finally, a provision would be added to the Water District No. 65 Rental Pool Procedures which would recommend to lessors of storage water that any proceeds from the rental of their storage water should be spent on practices or structures which would improve general water management in the delivery of water to their users. Mark Limbaugh and Jerry Gregg indicated they would each write a paragraph which could be inserted into the current rules, and present the proposed wording changes to the Advisory Board for further review.


The meeting was then adjourned in order that the Water District Pricing Committee could discuss these recommendations further.

RE: RENTAL POOL REQUEST FOR WATER DISTRICT 65-K

Dear Mr. Nokes:

I have reviewed your letter dated September 21, 1996 together with a letter dated November 5, 1996, from Mark Limbaugh relative to the above referenced request. The department will try to present your request to the Idaho Water Resource Board (Board) at its December meeting in Boise.

Enclosed for your information is a copy of the Board's Water Supply Bank Rules. Note that Rule 40 on page 8 of the rules addresses the appointment of local committees. This rule also describes other requirements which you must meet. As a part of the requirements, you need to adopt rental pool procedures.

Enclosed for your consideration is a draft copy of rental pool procedures which you should review and change as appropriate to meet the specific needs of the district as well as to comply with the Water Supply Bank rules. I have patterned the draft rules after those used by the Payette River Rental Pool. Hence, the rules may contain provisions which are not applicable to District 65-K. Please revise as appropriate and return to me if you want me top make the changes for you. Note that you likely may want to change the fees described in Rule 8 of the draft procedures.
