CONDITIONS OF APPROVAL

- Ground water diverted under this right is injected into the Blackfoot River in exchange for diverting water from the Blackfoot River at the point of rediversion to irrigate the place of use. Water shall not be diverted from the Blackfoot River unless ground water is simultaneously being injected into the Blackfoot River at an equal rate.
- Use of water under this right will be regulated by a watermaster with responsibility for the distribution of water among appropriators within a water district. At the time of this approval, this water right is within State Water District No. 27.
- Totalizing measuring devices shall be maintained at the well and at the rediversion pump from the Blackfoot River.
- Diversion and use of water under this right shall be reduced or curtailed when necessary to prevent injury to holders of prior rights diverted from the Blackfoot River downstream from the point of rediversion.


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5. This right when combined with all other rights shall provide no more than 0.02 cfs per acre nor exceed a combined annual maximum diversion volume of 1590.0 af at the field headgate for the lands above.
6. This right when combined with all other rights shall provide no more than 4.0 afa per acre at the field headgate for irrigation of the lands above.
7. Rights 27-0004N (Snake River Basin Adjudication Claim No. 27-12028) and 27-7088 when combined shall not exceed a total diversion rate of 6.05 cfs, a total annual maximum diversion volume of 1590.0 af at the field headgate, and the irrigation of 397 acres.
8. The right holder shall make full beneficial use of all surface water rights available to the right holder for irrigation of the lands authorized to be irrigated under this right. The right holder shall limit the diversion of ground water under this right to those times when the surface water supply is not available or the surface water supply is not reasonably sufficient to irrigate the place of use authorized under this right.
9. If the surface water right(s) appurtenant to the place of use is sold, transferred, leased or used on any other place of use, this right to divert groundwater shall not be used without an approved transfer pursuant to Section 42-222, Idaho Code, or approval of the Department if a transfer is not required.
10. Right 27-0004N (SRBA Claim No. 27-12028) is also diverted through the point of rediversion described above.

This license is issued pursuant to the provisions of Section 42-219, Idaho Code. The water right confirmed by this license is subject to all prior water rights and shall be used in accordance with Idaho law and applicable rules of the Department of Water Resources.
