RE: Measuring Device Requirement for Sinker Creek

Dear Interested Party:

Enclosed please find an order which requires that you install a measuring device and lockable controlling works on your diversion(s) from Sinker Creek no later than June 29, 1995. This order pertains to all diversions from Sinker Creek.

If you have questions about how to install an acceptable device, or about which types of devices are best suited to your creek please contact the Watermaster, Mary Blackstock, or Cindy Hodges of this office. They will be making an on-site inspection of the devices to determine which of the devices are acceptable for the continued delivery of water. This inspection is tentatively scheduled to be held on June 30.

While the present delivery accounting process is unchanged from recent years, some additional questions have arisen recently. Thus, the Watermaster and the Department will be meeting with you then to answer questions you may have about the procedure, and to discuss how delivery has been monitored thus far this year.

The Department finds that a number of the diversions from Sinker Creek and tributaries in Water District 57-D have inadequate measuring devices and lockable controlling works. Section 42-701, Idaho Code, provides in pertinent part:

42-701. INSTALLATION AND MAINTENANCE OF CONTROLLING WORKS AND MEASURING DEVICES BY WATER APPROPRIATORS -- PROCEDURE UPON FAILURE TO INSTALL AND MAINTAIN -- MEASURING AND REPORTING OF DIVERSIONS -- PENALTY FOR FAILURE TO COMPLY -- REPORT FILING FEE.

(1) The appropriators or users of any public waters of the state of Idaho shall maintain to the satisfaction of the director of the department of water resources suitable headgates and controlling works at the point where the water is diverted. Each device shall be of such construction that it can be locked and kept closed by the watermaster or other officer in charge, and shall also be of such construction as to regulate the flow of water at the diversion point. Each such appropriator shall construct and maintain, when required by the director of the department of water resources, a rating flume or other measuring device at such point as is most practical in such canal, ditch, wellhead or pipeline for the purpose of assisting the watermaster or department in determining the amount of water that may be diverted into said canal, wellhead or pipeline from the stream, well or other source of public water. Plans for such headgates, rating flumes or other measuring devices shall be approved by the department of water resources.

(3) Any appropriator or user of the public waters of the state of Idaho that neglects or refuses to construct or maintain such headgates, controlling works, or measuring devices. . . , upon receiving ten (10) days' notice from the director of the department of water resources within which to begin and

diligently pursue to completion the construction or installation of the required device or devices or to begin and diligently pursue to completion a remedy to such defects as exist in accordance with said notice, then the director of the department of water resources may order the duly qualified and acting watermaster of the water district to shut off and refuse to deliver at the point of diversion, the water owned by such appropriator or user until the user does construct and maintain such headgates, controlling works or measuring devices or remedy the defects which exist, or the director may take action pursuant to sections 42-311, 42-350 and 42-351, Idaho Code, to enforce the requirement to construct, install or maintain such devices.


(4) The appropriators or users of the public waters of the state of Idaho shall be given a reasonable time within which to complete construction of such headgates, controlling works or measuring devices, depending upon the size and extent thereof, when due diligence has been used in the prosecution of such work.

THEREFORE IT IS HEREBY ORDERED THAT:

1. Those water users identified in Attachment A of this order diverting water from Sinker Creek and its tributaries shall install and permanently maintain measuring devices and lockable controlling works of a type acceptable to the Department on or before June 29, 1995.

2. The watermaster shall shut off and refuse to deliver water from Sinker Creek and its tributaries to any water user identified in Attachment A who does not have adequate permanent lockable controlling works and a measuring device after June 29, 1995. In addition, the Department can take action to seek civil penalties of up to \$100 per diversion per day for those diversions which are not in compliance with this order.
