2004 meeting called to order 1-5-03 at 1:15 PM at the
Douglas County Courthouse Annex. Present: Charma Craig Baker,
Sec. Treas. Paul Nettleton, Mike Ahli, Doug Hipwell, Dan
Nelson (IDWA) and Don Hartley.

Minutes and Treas. Report were read and approved.

Officers were elected. (Same as last year)

Watermaster was elected. (Nick agreed to serve another yr.)

Budget was adopted with no changes from last yr.

Mike reported on the work done at the tunnel and entrance
to the canal. Nick Ahli, watermaster, reportedly approved
of the operation of the new weir and headgate.

Don Nelson reported that his office was bogged down
with extra paperwork with water transfers and passed out
updated snow survey reports. Paul reported deep snow
in the mtns that is probably close to 200% of normal
but cautioned that snowpack is very dry, mostly dry
powder type snow that holds little moisture. While
this is an excellent start to the season, dry soil will
also soak up much of the winter snow melt. But
with normal precip the rest of the winter, the water year
still should be the best in 3 or 4 yrs.
