Pursuant to our June 26<sup>th</sup> conversation, IDWR records indicate that Soelberg Farms is the holder of a consumptive water right with a priority date later than December 9, 1990. In June, 2006, the Willard H. and Ethel P. Stevens Trust purchased the parcel on which that well sits, and executed appropriate transfer documents with IDWR. This right is currently in permit form, approved July 31, 1998 for stockwater use for 500 head of range cattle, with a diversion rate of 0.11 CFS. Moore Land and Cattle currently leases the property.

The sole purpose of the well is to provide water to livestock on that pasture. It has a three horse power submersible pump which routes water through 2" pvc pipe to three stock tanks and one frost-free spigot. The stock tanks have a capacity of 12,000 gallons collectively, and each is equipped with a float valve. By any estimate, it appears unlikely that the daily output of the well would exceed the 13,000 gallon per day cutoff set by IC §42-111, IC §42-1401A(11), and IDAPA 37.03.11.20.11.

On a good year, the pasture probably has a carrying capacity of 500 head. However, this year has been very dry, so we pulled all but fifty head off last week. Considering that, the total water consumption is probably less than 1,000 gallons per day at this time, and will continue at that rate or lower through the end of the year.
