RE: Steve Lester's August 25 letter

Dear Ed,

I thought we had concurred in the Aug 23rd meeting, to give the IDWR what ever data they felt would help them to understand the results of our testing. If they want this in the form of computer generated graphs, then it is simple to supply them a disk if your two computers have compatible software.

At the end of the meeting, I felt no one disputed your professional work and presentation. I think the data clearly shows our wells above (north) the "wind sock" well are not materially affecting the Green house wells and thus should not be shutdown when the flow of the Green house wells stop. As you said, the entire valley's hot water, from Dry Creek to Table Rock, is and has been decreasing for a long time.

From the discussions at the meeting, Dan See and I understood it would take about a day to recover two feet in Flora's well from shutting down Quail Hollow's wells. If the well is now down eight feet then Dan should call for his right to be maintained 4 days before he needs it.

I am some what confused by the last paragraph, as to how our prior water right of the "wind sock" well (in addition my July 30, 1981 protest letter of the Gulf Course well) is being interpreted. To consider shutting us off without first turning off the "junior" well, measuring the recovery rate and estimating the lead-time needed to establish the Green house's flow, seems illegal.

Anyway Ed, I wanted to thank you for planning and coordinating all the measurements of these some 10 wells. You and the fellows were up several nights to take all these measurements, as often as every five minutes, and all the other difficulties that arose and were dealt with, like the hot water killing the fish. Again since this was done with the total cooperation of all the parties, in spite of the conflicts, different interests, personal inconveniences and costs, I certainly want to make all this data available to all these various parties.
