Hi Norm,

Ed Squires talked to me yesterday about the collection of monitoring data in Water District 63S. There are 5 geothermal users in the system: Ryan, Stralow, Edwards, Quail Hollow, and Terteling (which includes the wells at 36th and Hill, and the wells at his new Flora location up the canyon). I think there are about 10 geothermal wells in the district.

Ed said that the District members would like to know if they could pay the department to do the water measurements. It will be cheaper for them than paying a water master, or a private company. Another plus to this arrangement is that IDWR can collect the data according to the plan we want, and keep a closer tab on the use, and any problems that begin to surface. Sounds like the District would be willing to pay into an IDWR account, which we would draw from for the field work that I (or Helen) would do.

The downside is that it would be more field work for me (or Helen). Ed and I figured that it would take about 5 hours, once a month to measure the wells. This is probably a reasonable investment on our part to get consistent data, and especially since the time would be billable to the District.

What do you think of this proposal?
