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The Director of the Idaho Department of Water Resources ("Director") is required to divide the state into water districts for the purpose of distributing water among appropriators under the laws of the State of Idaho. The requirement to create water districts applies to those streams, or other water sources including ground water, for which the priorities of appropriation have been adjudicated by court decree. During a water rights adjudication, Idaho Code § 42-1417 authorizes the district court presiding over the adjudication to approve interim administration of the rights by the Director if reasonably necessary to protect senior rights. The district court may permit the distribution of water pursuant to chapter 6, title 42, Idaho Code, in accordance with partial decrees entered by the court or in accordance with a Director's Report, as may be modified by the court's order.

On December 21, 2006, the Snake River Basin Adjudication ("SRBA") District Court issued an order authorizing the Director to distribute ground water pursuant to chapter 6, title 42, Idaho Code, in accordance with the Director's Reports and partial decrees that have superseded the Director's Reports within Administrative Basin 27. The Director now proposes to revise the boundaries of Water District No. 120 to include ground water rights in that portion of Basin 27 overlying the Eastern Snake River Plain Aquifer ("ESPA"), as shown on the attached map. The purpose of the proposed action is to provide for the protection of senior water rights that are hydraulically connected to the ESPA. Inclusion of these rights in Water District No. 120 will allow the watermaster to administer these rights in accordance with the prior appropriation doctrine as established by Idaho law.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, pursuant to Idaho Code § 42-604, that the Director of the Department of Water Resources will conduct a public hearing regarding the revision of the boundaries of the water district as follows:

## PUBLIC HEARING FOR REVISION OF WATER DISTRICT NO. 120 BOUNDARIES:

Information and testimony presented at the hearing on January 29, 2007, will create a record upon which the Director will rely to determine whether revision of the boundaries of the

water district is appropriate. It is important that holders of water rights understand and participate in the hearing process. Persons attending the hearing will be provided an opportunity to provide oral testimony regarding the revision of the district boundaries. Written comments may also be submitted to the Director at the hearing or at any time prior to the close of the written comment period on February 8, 2007. Written comments not presented at the hearing can be sent to the Director to be received at the offices of the Department of Water Resources, P. O. Box 83720, Boise, ID, 83720-0098, no later than February 8, 2007.

The Director proposes that all ground water rights with points of diversion located within the revised boundaries be included in the district, except those used solely for domestic and/or stock water purposes as defined under Idaho Code §§ 42-111 and 42-1401A(11). The Director proposes exclusion of small domestic and stock water rights from the revised boundaries of the district because notice of creation or revisions of Water District No. 120 was not provided to holders of domestic and stock ground water rights and authorization for interim administration of such rights has not been granted by the SRBA District Court. Permitted and licensed rights not decreed in the SRBA and all future rights that may be licensed, if any, are subject to inclusion within the water district. This notice of hearing is being sent to all water right holders of record in accordance with these criteria.

The hearing will be conducted in a facility that meets the accessibility requirements of the Americans with Disabilities Act. Should you require special accommodations in order to attend, participate in, or understand the hearing, please contact the Department of Water Resources at least 10 days prior to the hearing or conference.
