PRESIDING OFFICER TIM LUKE: Good afternoon, my name is Tim Luke; I'm the Water Distribution Section Manager of the Idaho Department of Water Resources From Boise Idaho. I'm here today serving as the hearing officer in this matter. This matter concerns the proposed abolishment of the East Snake Plain Aquifer, East Water Measurement District. The district was created originally on September 16, 1996 for the purposes of measuring and reporting both ground water and surface water diversions within the department's administrative basins 21, 22, 25, 27, 29, 35 & 41 overlying the Eastern Snake Plain Aquifer. I need to make one correction there, that's surface water diversions that were not already in those basins and within the aguifer that were not already measured by the water district such as water district 01, which is the Upper Snake River Basin. The measurement district is no longer necessary since the water rights in these areas are now or soon will be within a Water District; specifically water district numbers 100 & 120. The water districts are authorized and have the responsibility for measuring and reporting diversion within the water districts, as well as enforcement and regulation of priority water rights

The provisions of Idaho Code § 42-604 require that this hearing to be held prior to abolishing the measurement district by the Director of the Department of Water Resources. The hearing is being conducted February 12, 2007, commencing at 1:45 P.M. at the Blackfoot City Council Chambers located at 157 N. Broadway, Blackfoot, Idaho. The second hearing on this matter will be held on February 27th, 2007 at 1:00 P.M., at the Best Western Cotton tree Inn at Rexburg Idaho. That hearing is being held on that date at that location as a matter of convenience to water users that may have diversions in measurement district the Rigby, Rexburg and St. Anthony areas.

The purpose of this hearing is to provide affected water right holders or their representatives, an opportunity to make oral statements, on the record stating their position, views, or concerns on the proposed abolishment of the East Snake Plain Aquifer West Water Measurement District

For the purposes of this hearing, persons making statements do not need to be sworn, nor will they be subject to cross-examination. All persons signing up to speak will be heard before others are heard, all persons wishing to speak will be heard once before anyone speaks a second time.

 Notice of this hearing was mailed to each affected water user in the East Measurement District as required under the provisions of Idaho Code section § 42-706. If there are no further questions, we are now at the point where we can begin taking statements and comments from those persons who desire to be heard in this proceeding. Prior to the commencement of the hearing I gave some general background information and put the number of questions from those attending today, starting about 1:00 P.M. so for about the past 45 minutes we just had a discussion about the proposed action.

Has everyone signed in? Who didn't sign? I think we will just keep passing it around

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Ok at this point I would ask Mr. Robert Murdock to please come forward and make a statement for the record. Before proceeding with your statement please state your name and address and indicate if you are speaking for yourself or representing others.

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Let me grab you a seat.

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Before making a statement can you please state your name and address, also please indicate if you are speaking for yourself only or representing others.

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82 83 Mr. ROBERT MURCOCK: My name is Robert Murdock. I live at 1473 W Hoff Rd. Blackfoot. I am speaking for myself as a stakeholder, expressing my concerns about the overall process that we keep being taken down with the different ground water districts, measurement districts. I believe that the groundwater act of that was passed in 1951 gave us some protection over the priority administration. It was said to be full economic development of the resource. The groundwater act has basically been undermined; in my opinion by the basin wide issue five and the Musser case, which has lead to the development of the model. The model and the interpretations that the department has been using on it, the department has chosen to use the model as an administrative tool. I do not believe that that has been refined enough at this point in time to be used as an administrative tool. There is more we still do not understand about the aquifer and its flows. One thing that came out in the Swan Falls settlement, listening to some of the discussion on that was that flows per spring was not guaranteed, and this is where we are being, I believe, misled a little by some of the policy. That the flows are not guaranteed on the springs. The Swan Falls agreement basically set that. That the flows would be the flows of the agreement and as ground water pumpers we are being asked now for a different standard. The rules are being changed in the middle of the game with the recent issue 5 on the conjunctive management. I do not believe that the plain was designed by the legislation of the groundwater act to be administered with prior appropriation because the unique characteristics of the Snake River Plain. What we are being asked to do basically pay for our own guillotine With our measurement districts, I don't agree with that. I wish the department would reconsider some of their philosophies and their interpretations of these laws. Thank You.

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PRESIDING OFFICER TIM LUKE: Thank you Mr. Murdock. Mr. Quinton Blackburn. Before you give your statement please state your name and address and whether you are representing yourself or anybody else.

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QUINTON BLACKBURN: My name is Quinton Blackburn. My address is 1955 W 802 S, Springfield. I am representing Springfield Water District, Chairman of the Board. And I suppose our main concern is how all this is going to affect the water

dist we have a 25 27 member hook up for our well with just a 15 horse hookup and we are assist and were just concerned about how this is going to affect our district. That's all I have got to say. Thank you

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PRESIDING OFFICER TIM LUKE: Let me ask you a question real quick. Are you currently in Water District 120, do you know?

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OUINTON BLACKBURN: Yes.

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PRESIDING OFFICER TIM LUKE: So you are already measuring and reporting your water use to Water District 120.

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QUINTON BLACKBURN: Yes

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PRESIDING OFFICER TIM LUKE: Ok. Has everybody signed in? This is for the hearing abolishing the East Measurement District. It appears no one else has signed to testify. Is their anybody that said they didn't wish to testify but now wishes to testify? Is there anyone who gave comments that wishes to give additional comments? If so, then that will conclude the record of oral statements in this proceeding. Thank you all for your participation. The hearing record will remain open through March 9th, 2007 to allow time after the 2nd hearing for the submittal of additional written comments, as provided in the notice in this proceeding as required by Idaho Code Section 42-706. I will issue a preliminary order following the close of the comment period after March 9. A copy of the preliminary order will be sent by regular mail to all holders affected by the order. The preliminary order can and will become a final order without further action with the department unless any party petitions for reconsideration or file an exception within 14 days after service of the preliminary order. Any party aggrieved by any final order with the Director, may seek judicial review before the district court within 28 days of the order becoming final or within 28 days of the action taken of the petition for reconsideration. Thank you for attending, the record is now closed except for the taking of additional comments.
