**Re: REQUEST FOR EXEMPTION FROM ORDER REQUIRING  
INSTALLATION OF MEASURING DEVICE OR ACCEPTANCE  
OF MEASURING DEVICE IN PLACE**

To Whom It May Concern:

The undersigned is the owner of water rights in Administrative Basin 71. The water source is Goat Creek; the Diversion name is GC6 and GC7B; and, the water rights numbers are 71-4055B, 71-10854 and 71-10853.

The water rights re currently used for irrigation and stock water. Over the years, I have found that I can more effectively irrigate and water pasture for horses by the use of two 5 HP electric pumps placed in Goat Creek at the places of diversion. The pumps are only utilized an hour or two per day. The two pumps have manual on/off switches.

Out of an abundance of caution, I ran water through the ditches to flood irrigate each year. My effective water use can be controlled by the water master directing that I not engage the pump if necessary or only engage it for a certain for a certain period of time. The exact water usage can be determined in this manner by multiplying the time and by the rate of flow per minute.

I request exemption from the requirement to install a weir, flume or submerged orifice at the point of diversion.
