Gentlemen:

During the meeting on March 14, 1995, at 3:00 p.m. at the Clark County Courthouse, Watermaster, Don Shenton stated that in the past years the "stock" water at George Whittaker's had been abused. It was also reported that his headgate and weir were in bad shape and it would be impossible to shut water off due to the condition of the headgate. Therefore, the undersigned makew these request to the officers and board of water district 32-c

The undersigned request that All headgates and weirs be in good working order or NO water shall be delivered. This is in accordance with the adopted resolution headlined "Headgates and Weirs" adopted during such water meeting March 14, 1995.

Let it be known that the undersigned agrees to let "stock" water over weir only until the first water user with a valid water right starts to get his or her water right reduced.

The undersigned feels these demands are very necessary and that All water users, whether for forage or stock, be in compliance with All resolutions adopted during the water meetings.

The undersigned also feels that during these times, when water is very valuable, that no water should be wasted in this manner. If need be equipment should be brought in to do needed repairs just as other water users have to do to keep necessary measuring devices in good working order.

During the 1994 water season a letter sent to users dated September 30, 1994 accused water users of harassment of watermasters. The undersigned request that action be taken on matters discussed in this letter and feel it is in line with the duties and responsibilities of watermaster, and his Deputy and therefore, not considered harassment.
