ADOPTED AT THE ANNUAL MEETING OF THE WATER USERS OF

WATER DISTRICT No. 43-B

Meeting Minutes of the Upper Raft River Water District 43-B.

A meeting for Raft River Water District 43-B Water users was held January 14, 1991 at the Raft River Electric building in Malta, Idaho. The meeting began at 1:45 PM. Those in attendance were Jay Harper, Robert Hope, Boyd Booth, Lano Elison, Elbert Durfee, Bill Jones, Bruce Durfee, Jack Erickson, Berry Anderson, Dwayne Ward, Doug Freestone, Olen Ward, Alan Harper, Dave Hammons and Jack Pierce.

Dwayne Ward nominated Jay Harper to be chairman of the meeting. Berry Anderson seconded the motion and moved that nominations cease. Jay Harper was elected chairman by acclamation.

The minutes of the past meeting held January 8, 1990 were read by Boyd Booth. A discussion followed and the decision was made to include water measurements of Reed Springs in today's meeting minutes. Last year's minutes were approved as read.

It was proposed that Robert Hope be retained as Secretary-treasurer for the district. Approval was unanimous.

It was moved and seconded that a credentials committee not be appointed as those water users in attendance reviewed and approved the Watermaster's 1990 Report and proposed budget for 1991. The proposed budget is to remain the same as last year's budget of \$1680.00.

The salary for the watermaster was discussed. It was proposed that the watermaster's salary should remain the same as last year at \$55.00/day. The motion was unanimously approved.

It was proposed that Robert Hope continue as watermaster and that he serve continuously until his successor is duly elected and qualified. The motion carried unanimously.

It was proposed that Idaho Code 42-617 be adopted to assure collection of Water District 43-B assessments. Code 42-617 reads:

"No ditch, canal company, or water user shall have the right to demand and receive water, and the watermaster shall not deliver to such person until the amount due and payable from user, as fixed by the budget, has been paid."

Approval was unanimous.

Each water district is required to handle funds collected by the district and to pay the watermaster and other expenses for the district. Notices for water assessments will be sent to each water user in District 43-B by Cassia County Treasurer's office. Money from each user will be collected by the County Treasurer who will then mail the proceeds to the treasurer of Water District 43-B. Disbursements of funds will be authorized by checks signed by the Chairman and the Treasurer.

It was proposed that the existing advisory committee of Jay Harper, Boyd Booth and Doug Freestone be reappointed for another year. Approval was unanimous.

Problems caused by the drought were discussed. One problem is that Reed Springs did not flow the usual amount of water after the pumping season. Irrigation pumps around Reed Springs cause the flow to stop during the pumping season, but the springs normally start to flow within 24 hours and reach a normal flow of 2.7 cfs within 5 or 6 days. Four years of drought conditions have changed Reed Springs. In 1989, the flow from Reed Springs did not start until about 6 days after pumps were turned off and full flow was not realized until the end of December 1989 (approximately 4 months after the pumping season). In 1990, the flow from Reed Springs did not start until about 10 days after pumps were turned off and only 50% of normal flow is flowing after 4.5 months. It is believed that water that usually comes out of Utah, but is not flowing, may affect the flow of Reed Springs.

assessments will be sent to each water user in District 43-B by Cassia County Treasurer's office. Money from each user will be collected by the County Treasurer who will then mail the proceeds to the treasurer of Water District 43-B. Disbursements of funds will be authorized by checks signed by the Chairman and the Treasurer.

It was proposed that the existing advisory committee of Jay Harper, Boyd Booth and Doug Freestone be reappointed for another year. Approval was unanimous.

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The Water Right License number 43-7086 from the Idaho Department of Water Resources was reviewed. The license allows pumping of groundwater from April 1 to November 1 each year in the amount of 6.23 cfs and 1260.0 acre feet with the condition that a normal flow of Reed Springs be returned to the Raft River channel if pumping depletes the flow from Reed Springs.

Past records of meeting minutes from March 1, 1964 were read by Olen Ward. The records state that, "the Watermaster be instructed to keep a record on Reed Springs by measuring water from the spring before and after the drilled wells, owned by Jack Erickson and Elbert Durfee located near the spring, start to pump to determine how much the wells effect the flow of the spring while these wells are pumping, and that the watermaster request the owners of the wells to supply adequate measuring devices to measure water form the wells back into the creek channel."

The question was asked if the pumpers have lived up to the agreements of returning water to the river bed. One person does not think so. Reed Springs is not flowing the normal amount even though the water table is normal at about 16 feet in the

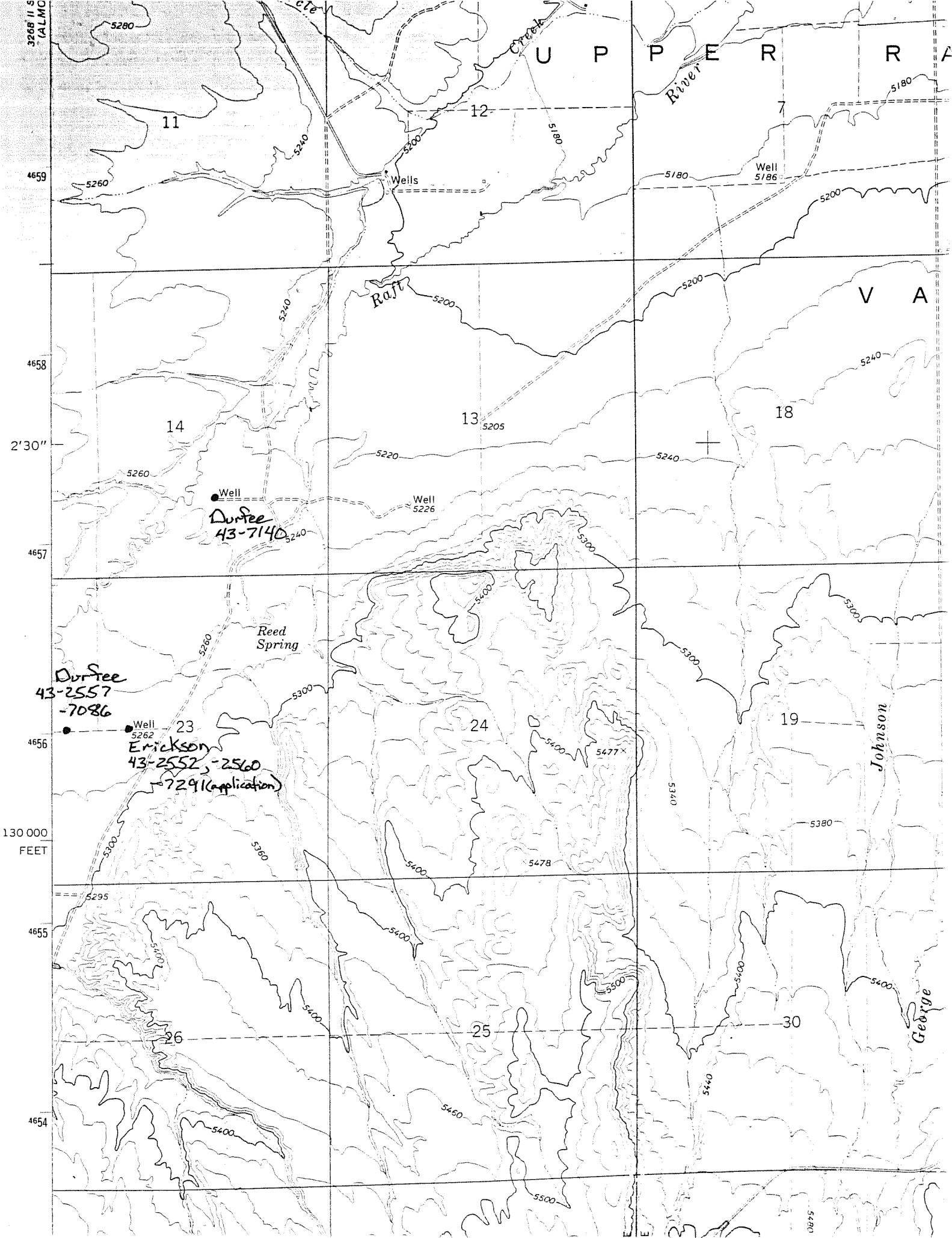

**CONDITIONS OF APPROVAL**

- a. Modifications to or variance from this license must be made within the limits of Section 42-222, Idaho Code, or the applicable Idaho Law. This right may be forfeited by five years of non-use.
- b. The right to the use of the water hereby confirmed is restricted and appurtenant to lands or place of use herein described, and is subject to all prior water rights, as provided by the laws of Idaho.
- c. Any water right confirmed in this license for hydropower purposes shall be junior and subordinate to all rights to the use of water, other than hydropower, within the State of Idaho that are initiated later in time than the priority of this license and shall not give rise to any right or claim against any future rights to the use of water other than hydropower, within the State of Idaho initiated later in time than the priority of this license.

The maximum combined rate of diversion under this right and Right Nos. 43-2557 & 43-7087 shall not exceed 12.43 cfs.

Use of water under this license is subject to control by the watermaster of State Water District No. 43B, Upper Raft River.

Flows of Reed Springs, depleted by pumpage of groundwater under this license, shall be replaced to protect prior water rights.

Meeting Minutes for the Upper Raft River Water District 43-B.

A Meeting for the Raft River Water District 43-B water users was held January 9, 1989 at the Raft River Electric building in Malta, Id. The meeting began at 2:10 PM. Those in attendance were Barry Anderson, Kent Bedke, Boyd Booth, Bruce Durfee, Elbert Durfee, Kent Durfee, Alan Harper, Jay Harper, Lano Elison, Robert Hope, J. D. Hutchison, Jack Pierce, Dwayne Ward, and Gary Funderburg from the Idaho Department of Water Resources.

Jay Harper was nominated as Chairman of the meeting by Jack Pierce. Robert Hope seconded the nomination and moved that nominations cease. Jay Harper was elected chairman by acclamation.

Robert Hope was nominated as Secretary by Dwayne Ward. Kent Durfee seconded that nomination and moved that nominations cease. Robert Hope was elected secretary by acclamation.

Minutes of last years meeting were read by Alan Harper.

A Credentials Committee was not appointed as those water users in attendance reviewed and approved the watermaster's Report and Proposed Budget.

Salary for the Watermaster was discussed. Jay Harper moved and Robert Hope seconded that the watermaster's salary remain the same as last year at \$45.00 per day. The motion carried.

Other expenses such as Social Security, Secretary Time, Postage and emergency expenses were approved at 465.00 dollars as stated in the watermaster's proposed Budget. Dwayne Ward proposed the budget of \$1680 for 1989 be approved. Boyd Booth seconded the motion. The motion carried.

The secretary had checked with the county tax collectors office since last meeting and found that the water district had a reserve account of \$2995.00. Collection of the fees to water users will continue through the Cassia County Tax Collectors Office. Jay Harper proposed that Idaho Code, 42-617 be adopted to assure collection of Water District 43-B assessments. Code 42-617 reads:

"No ditch, Canal Company, or water user shall have the right to demand and receive water, and the watermaster shall not Deliver to such person until the amount due and payable from user, as fixed by the budget, has been paid,"

The motion was seconded by Kent Bedke. The motion carried.

Jack Pierce proposed that Robert Hope continue as watermaster and that he serve continuously until his successor is duly elected and qualified. Bruce Durfee seconded the motion. The motion carried.

Dwayne Ward proposed that the same advisory committee of Jack Pierce, Jay Harper and Boyd Booth be retained for 1989. The motion was seconded by Alan Harper. The motion carried. This committee will be responsible for transacting business for District 43-B.

A discussion was held about problems with beaver dams along the river. Appreciation was expressed for the efforts of the Idaho Fish and Game personnel in removing the beaver and dams from the river. Jack Pierce proposed that Idaho Fish and Game personnel continue to remove beaver from the upper raft river channel. The proposal was seconded by Kent Bedke. Proposal was approved.

A discussion was had about Reed Springs and the problems of no water in the upper Raft River last summer. Jack Pierce proposed that a committee be appointed to study the flow from Reed Springs. A committee of Bruce Durfee, Kent Durfee, Barry Anderson, Robert Hope and Jack Pierce was appointed.

A resolution was proposed by Dwayne Ward that the amount of water from Reed Springs will be measured by the watermaster prior to the pumping season and at regular intervals during the pumping season. It was also proposed that weirs be repaired for the measuring of water. The proposal included that during the pumping season when the flow from Reed Springs is decreased by irrigation pumps from Ridge River Ranch and Durfee Farms, that the amount of water equal to the flow of Reed Springs shall be returned to the river channel from the irrigation pumps. The Ridge River Ranch shall return two-thirds of the Reed Springs flow and Durfee Farms shall return one-third of the Reed Springs flow. The resolution was seconded by Kent Durfee. The resolution was approved.

Minutes of the Raft River Water District 43-B, Malta, Idaho, January 12, 1987. The meeting was held at the Raft River Rural Electric Building at 2:15 PM. Those in attendance were Elmo Elison, Lano Elison, John Pierce, Robert Hope, Jay Harper, Loyd Booth, and Terry Blau. Mr. Blau represented the Water Resources office in Twin Falls, Idaho.

Elmo Elison was nominated as Chairman of the meeting by John Pierce. Jay Harper seconded the nomination. The motion carried.

Robert Hope was nominated as Secretary for the meeting and District by Elmo Elison. The nomination was seconded by Boyd Booth. The nomination carried.

The Credentials Committee was not appointed as those present received and approved the Watermaster's report and proposed budget.

Terry Blau discussed that watermasters are now bonded under the State Risk Management System, so there is no need for Watermasters to obtain a separate bond.

Salary for Watermaster was discussed. John Pierce moved and Jay Harper seconded that the watermaster's salary remain the same as last year at \$45.00 per day. The motion carried.

Other expenses such as Social Security, Secretary time, postage, and emergency expenses were approved at \$520.00 as stated in the Watermaster's proposed budget. John Pierce moved that the money budgeted for a Surety Bond be placed in the emergency expense fund. The motion was seconded by Robert Hope. The motion carried. A total budget of \$2230.00 for the year as proposed by the Watermaster was unanimously approved.

John Pierce proposed that Robert Hope continue as Watermaster and that he serve continuously until his successor is duly elected and qualified. Lano Elison seconded the motion. It passed unanimously.

Elmo Elison proposed that Idaho Code, 42-617 be adopted to assure collection of Water District 43-B assessments. Section 42-617 reads:

"That no ditch, canal company, or other water user shall have the right to demand and receive water, and the watermaster shall not deliver to such person until the amount due and payable from such user, as fixed by the budget, has been paid."


The motion was seconded by John Pierce. Motion carried.

Elmo Elison proposed that the same Advisory Committee of John Pierce, Jay Harper and Loyd Booth be retained for 1987. The motion was seconded by Robert Hope. Motion Carried. This committee will be responsible for transacting Business for District 43-B. Business includes repairs to the channel in case of flood damage and to take appropriate action in case of flood or emergencies. The committee may be called upon to resolve problems on the local level as they arise.

A discussion was held concerning Medicare Tax. It was determined that the tax does not apply to the Watermaster's salary as long as he serves continuously and was employed before April 1, 1986. He is covered by the "Continuing Employment Exception" Clause stated in the IRS notice 767.

It was resolved that the next annual meeting be held on January 11, 1988 at 2:00 PM. The motion was proposed by Elmo Elison and seconded by Robert Hope. The motion carried.

Lano Elison proposed that the meeting be adjourned at 3:15 PM. John Pierce seconded the motion. The meeting was adjourned until next year.

Minutes of the Raft River Water District 43-B, Malta, Idaho, Jan. 13, 1986. The meeting was held at the Raft River Electric Board Room at 2:30 PM. Those in attendance were Elmo Elison, John Pierce, Robert Hope and Jay Harper.

Elmo Elison was elected Chairman and Robert Hope was elected Secretary to replace John Pierce.

The Credentials Committee was dispensed with as those present had reviewed and approved the watermaster's report and proposed budget.

It was discussed that the Watermaster be elected Secretary because he sends in Social Security Statements of Wages Paid and files quarterly reports to the IRS. He also requests his wages through the Cassia County Clerk. A budget of \$100.00 was approved for the Secretary to use for Surety Bond, postage and labor. Robert Hope agreed to serve as Secretary of Water District 43-B.

Salary for Watermaster was discussed. John Pierce moved and Jay Harper seconded that the Watermaster's salary be \$45.00 per day. Social Security and contingency expenses were also included in the proposed budget of \$2250.00 for the year. The District's share of Social Security will be paid directly to the Watermaster. He in turn will pay the Social Security tax to the State Auditor, State of Idaho. The motion passed unanimously.

John Pierce proposed that Robert Hope continue as Watermaster and that he serve continuously until his successor is elected. Jay Harper seconded the motion. It passed unanimously.

An Advisory Committee of John Pierce, Jay Harper and Boyd Booth was proposed by Elmo Elison. The motion was seconded by John Pierce. This committee will be responsible for transacting business for District 43-B between now and the next annual meeting. Business includes repairs to the channel in case of flood damage and to take appropriate action in case of emergencies. Motion carried.

A discussion was held concerning adequate funds for possible projects in case of emergencies. It is true that Water District 43-B does have a reserve of funds with the Cassia County Treasurer. These funds can be used pending approval by the Advisory Committee. It was moved by Jay Harper and seconded by John Pierce that a contingency amount of \$300.00 be added to the budget to help pay for possible emergency expenses. Motion carried.

Elmo Elison suggested that Idaho Code, 42-617 be used to assure collection of Water District 43-B assessments. Section 42-617 reads:

"That no ditch, canal company, or other water user shall have the right to demand and receive water, and the watermaster shall not deliver to such person until the amount due and payable from such user, as fixed by the budget, has been paid."

Motion was seconded by John Pierce. Motion carried.

Elmo Elison moved and Robert Hope seconded that the next annual meeting should be held on the second Monday in January 1987. Motion carried.

Meeting adjourned 4:15 PM.

Minutes of the Raft River Water Dist. 43-B Malta, Idaho Jan. 29, held at the Raft River Electric Board room. 1:50 p.m.

Because of no attendance at scheduled Jan. 14th meeting, Chairman Elmo Elison rescheduled this meeting for Jan. 29th.

Those in attendance: John Pierce, Elmo Elison, Robert Hope, Boyd Booth.

Elmo Elison and John Pierce were re-elected Chairman and Secretary respectively.

The credentials committee was dispensed with as those present had reviewed the Water master's report and proposed budget.

It was noted that we did not have a watermaster in 1984 because of flooding and excess water,

Salary for Watermaster discussed. John Pierce moved and Boyd Booth seconded that the water master's salary be \$ 45.00 per day and that \$ 2165.00 be budgeted, which will include, besides salary Social security and incidentals. The district's share of Social security will be paid directly to the watermaster, who in turn will pay the Social security tax for Dist. 43-B. Passed unanimously.

John Pierce moved and Boyd Booth seconded the motion that Robert Hope be elected Water master and that he serve continuously until his successor is elected and qualified. Passed unanimously.

There was considerable discussion of beaver damage and flood damage to Raft River chanel. John Pierce moved and Boyd Booth seconded the motion that the Idaho Fish and Game Dept. be requested to remove all beaver from the Raft River in Dist. 43-B. Motion carried

Moved by Boyd Booth and seconded by John Pierce that Dist. Advisory board will be Boyd Booth, Jay Harper and John Pierce. That this committee will be responsible for transacting all Dist. 43-B business between now and the next annual meeting. Motion carried.


Moved by John Pierce and seconded by Boyd Booth that the proposed budget may not provide adequate funds for the Watermaster's salary or maintain projects in case of emergencies. However, Water Dist. 43-B does have a reserve of funds with the Cassia County Treasurer previously appropriated for such emergencies and may be used after approval and recommendations by the Dist. 43-B Advisory committee. Motion carried.

Elmo Elison suggested that Sec. 2 be used for collection of Water Dist. 43-B dues. Section 2 reads:

"That no ditch, canal company or other water users shall have the right to demand and receive water, and the watermaster shall not deliver to such persons until the amount due and payable from such user, as fixed by the budget, has been paid." Seconded by Boyd Booth. Motion carried.

John Pierce moved and Boyd Booth seconded that the next meeting date should be the second Monday in January, 1986. Motion carried.

Jay Harper, representing Malta Land and Irrigation moved that

Elmo Elison moved that whereas all users present have reviewed  
the Watermaster's reports and budgets that we dispense with the  
Credential's Committee report. Motion passed.

Salary for the Watermaster was discussed. Jay Harper moved  
that the Watermaster's salary be raised to \$45.00 per day or a  
total budgeted salary of \$1710.00. Also that \$114.57 be budgeted  
for Social Security. This money will be paid directly to the Water-  
master, who, in turn will pay the Social Security tax for Dist. 43-B.  
Motion seconded by John Pierce. Motion passed.

Joe Hepworth resigned as Watermaster. The Advisory Committee  
was instructed to find and hire a watermaster and that he serve  
continuously until his successor is duly elected and qualified.  
The committee, in the last week of March finally persuaded Gary  
Fowles to become Watermaster for 1982.

There was considerable discussion of beaver damage and flood  
damage to Raft River Chanel. John Pierce moved and Jay Harper
