MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

186

This memorandum of understanding is entered into by and between the State of Idaho Department of Water Resources, hereinafter referred to as the Department, and the water users of Water District 45-0, hereinafter referred to as the District, acting through the representative elected by the water users of the District.

WHEREAS, the statutes of the State of Idaho provide for the Department to administer and supervise the distribution of the waters of the State for those holding rights to the use thereto;

WHEREAS, those members of the District present at the annual meeting voted to enter into a cooperative agreement with the Department whereby the Department will provide watermaster services to the District; and

WHEREAS, an elected representative of the District will serve to advise the Department in matters relating to the operation of Water District 45-0;

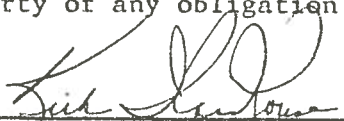
NOW, THEREFORE, the Department agrees to provide the following services to the District, effective upon signature of this memorandum and upon authorization and adoption of the budget to implement the Memorandum at the annual meeting of the District in March:

- 1) To provide watermaster and associated services to the District for a period of one year. Such services will be provided under the direction of the Regional Supervisor of the Department's Southern Region, consistent with Chapter 6 Title 42 of the Idaho Code.
- 2) To provide the part-time services of a Department employee during the period of this Memorandum for the operations of Water District 45-0.
- 3) To provide the Department vehicles for use by employees of the Department, to conduct District business, and to share the use of other Department equipment and facilities as necessary to equitably distribute the water to the users within the District.

WATER DISTRICT 45-0 agrees as follows:

- 1) To pay the Department, on an advance basis, sufficient funds to cover the costs of operations incurred in providing watermaster and associated services to the District. These costs shall include the personnel cost of the Department employee during the time he is engaged in watermaster duties for the District, any mileage and per diem costs at the rate established by law for state employees, and indirect costs of 14% for the use of office space, stationary, supplies, etc.

Nothing in this Memorandum will act to change, modify, or release either party of any obligation or responsibility provided by contract or by law.

Water District 45-0 does hereby agree to share in establishing and maintaining the observation stations; such share being:

1. Provide \$500.00 for the installation of recorders, shelters, and accessory equipment.
2. Construct and maintain fence around observation stations.
3. Provide for the removal of existing well caps and the construction of support brackets to be attached to the well casing.

Water District 45-0 does hereby agree to grant to the Department of Water Resources reasonable ingress and egress to observe and service the observation stations.
