Water Master Treasurer

Connely Baldwin opened the meeting at 2:00 p.m. and asked for introductions, then nominations for meeting chairman. David Miles moved to have Connely Baldwin act as Chair. Randy Udy seconded. Motion carried.

Alan Smith moved to have Austin Moses act as meeting secretary. Randy Udy seconded. Motion carried.

Austin Moses read a summary of the minutes of the February 5, 2019 annual meeting. David Miles moved to approve the minutes. Randy Udy seconded. Motion carried.

Advisory Board Election. David Miles moved to nominate Connely Baldwin, David Miles, Alan Smith, Randy Udy, Keith Jorgensen and Steve Meek to serve on the advisory board. Alan Smith seconded. Motion carried.

Water Master Election. Randy Udy moved to approve Josh Hanks as Watermaster. David Miles seconded. Motion carried.

Treasurer Election. David Miles moved to retain Austin Moses. Randy Udy seconded. Motion carried.

Josh Hanks presented the annual Water Master Report. He reported that the Bear River Commission toured sections of the River and were hosted for lunch at Stoddard Farms. Water delivery cost amounted to \$.13 per 24 hr CFS for the 2019 water year. Josh also reported that the telemetry system was upgraded from 3G to a 4G system with Verizion. The 4G system uses more data and required an upgrade of the data plan. The water

delivery was uneventful with little useage of storage water. Keith Jorgensen moved to accept the watermaster report. Alan Smith seconded. Motion carried.

Connely Baldwin presented a projection of the new water year saying that there should be sufficient water in the River for 2020. Current snow fall is approximately 112% of normal accumulation. Bear Lake elevation is currently at 5918.11 feet. The Lake peaked at 5920.28 ft during 2019. Runoff forecast is 160,000 acre feet. Soil moisture at the top is a little below average. The current water supply forecast indicates a full allocation of Bear Lake Irrigation storage water.

Ethan Geisler reported working on the water rights accounting model for the Bear River. He said the model starts when Pacificorp releases storage water from Bear Lake and goes until September 30th. Last year required less storage water than normal. He explained the process of emergency thresholds and the allocations when an emergency is declared. Ethan reported that a Bear River Watershed model is now being worked on.

Austin Moses presented the financial statements for the previous year and reported that the only significant overage was the excess data usage and cost for the telemetry system. The total expenses for 2019 came in at \$82,631 and total cash at January 31, 2020 was \$24,956. Alan Smith moved to approve the financial report. David Miles seconded. Motion carried.

Austin then presented the proposed budget for the 2020 year. He noted that the only significant change for 2020 was a 3% raise for the water master and an increase for the telemetry system. The needed assessment would rise to \$81,000. Randy Udy moved to approve the budget and assessment. David Miles seconded. Motion carried.

Austin Moses presented a list of overdue assessments and received some help in contacting the individuals.

Michael Holliday reported that a bill for the adjudication of the Bear River water rights was introduced into committee at the Idaho Legislature yesterday. He said if the Legislature approves it will then go to the Idaho Supreme Court to appoint a judge of the adjudication, then to IDWR to proceed. Since northern Idaho is still in the process of adjudication it will probably be a couple of years before action is started.

Next meeting will be held February 1, 2021 at 2:00 pm.
