Welcome:

Secretary Wayne Martin called the meeting to order and thanked everyone for

attending.

Minutes:

Secretary Martin asked if there were any additions or corrections to be made to the minutes of the previous meeting. Dan Surmeier moved and Doyle Fackler seconded to approve the August 8, 2017, minutes. The motion

carried.

Financial

Report:

Secretary Martin asked Ron Shurtleff to report on the financial condition of the District. His report contained the following financial status:

Secretary Martin asked if there were any questions regarding the financial report.

Marc Haws moved, Doyle Fackler seconded, to approve the October 10, 2017, financial statement as presented, the <u>motion carried</u>

IDWR Report:

Secretary Martin turned the floor over to Dan Stanaway, Technical Hydrologist, IDWR. Mr. Stanaway handed out packets and reported on the Payette River Accounting and Reconciliation.

Dan noted that following the high snow pack of last winter, the river's natural flow has been running higher than normal throughout the year and continues to be above average. This caused the day of allocation to occur later in the season than usual. Demand on the river seemed to be down from usual as well. He reported the end result is a smaller amount of storage usage and reservoirs that ended the season with higher contents. Dan displayed a chart which compared the 2017 natural flow to the historical median, and the preceding two years.

Mr. Stanaway demonstrated with historical records and charts the correlation between the timing of the Day of Allocation, storage usage, and storage carryover. Dan noted in contrast with the 2011 year when the Day of Allocation fell on July 31st and the reservoirs ended the season with such high carryover.

Dan went over the Storage Reconciliation sheet and noted the averaging error of only 350 acre feet.

Secretary Martin thanked Mr. Stanaway and turned the floor over to Watermaster Ron Shurtleff

Watermaster

Report:

Ron stated he would try to be brief since Mr. Stanaway had presented such an inclusive recap of the 2017 season. Ron displayed the usual reservoir charts and pointed out how much higher the levels of Deadwood and Cascade reservoirs are in comparison to when we started into the 2017 water year. He also displayed the daily storage usage sheets that he prepares for the major storage users in the basin. Ron noted the reduced storage use amounts for both Black Canyon Irrigation District and Emmett Irrigation District. Ron stressed that these figures will change when the final accounting run takes into account the small diversion which will be entered into the accounting in the next few weeks.

Cost Share Program:

Ron moved on to the Cost Share Program. He reported several of the 2017 projects have turned in statements of completion and to date eight projects have been funded for a total outlay of \$48,577.61. Ron stated that a few projects were completed under budget. Ron noted when all projects are complete the district will invest approximately \$95,319 to the outstanding projects. Ron displayed the 2018 Cost Share applications list and noted the Last Chance Ditch has notified

him of a project to do some piping, and he is anticipating a formal application from the Canal Company.

Gage Station Above BCID:

Ron reported an effort to establish an additional gage station above Black Canyon Reservoir, and below the Horseshoe Bend Hydro Generation plant. Ron stated the purpose of this is to gain better knowledge of the water flow coming to Black Canyon reservoir in an effort to smooth out the flow downstream from Black Canyon Dam. Ron elaborated that the idea has been active since 2011 after it was proposed during the Spring Operators Meeting at Black Canyon Dam.

Ron reported that back in 2012 he had contacted the Engineering Leader in the Streamflow department of the Idaho Power company to see if they would be willing to contract the installation and maintenance of a gage in the specified location. Ron included correspondence between Mr. Pete Vidmar which indicated the power company would be willing to undertake the task.

Ron reported the new gage station is still in the planning stage, but if funding for it can be worked out, the gage may become a reality.

Davis Cattle Monitor:

As a point of interest, Ron displayed photos of the gage that was installed at Davis Cattle Company and said it appears to work very well but as yet it has not been calibrated to insure accurate monitoring at the diversion. Ron said he has requested the Department of Water Resources to bring a portable ultrasonic flow meter to the site next year to verify correct calibration of the unit.

Budget Committee;

Ron announced the Budget and Nominating Committee meeting is scheduled to be held in the Emmett irrigation office on October 5, 2017 at 1:00 pm. The committee members are:
