Connely Baldwin opened the meeting at 2:00 p.m. and asked for introductions, then nominations for meeting chairman. Joe Larsen moved to have Connely Baldwin act as Chair. Bill Robison seconded. Motion carried.

Austin Moses as secretary was moved by Connely Baldwin, seconded by Joe Larsen. Motion carried.

Austin Moses read a summary of the minutes of the February 4, 2014 annual meeting which were approved.

Advisory Board Election. Craig Wilkin nominated the present board. Dan Forsgren seconded. Motion carried.

Water Master Election. Micah Jensen moved to approve Josh Hanks as Watermaster. Pete Peterson seconded. Motion carried.

Treasurer Election. Pete Peterson moved to retain Austin Moses. Micah Jensen seconded. Motion carried.

Josh Hanks presented the annual Water Master Report. The water year was a good one with very little difficulty obtaining enough water. The Lifton pumps were shut off on August 25, 2014 and remained off the rest of the season due to the fall rains. Josh reported the cost of supplying water was approximately \$.13 per 24 hour second feet. Micah Jensen commented on the difficulty of getting upstream users to cut back when supplies are short. Computer estimates are useful to predict flow but are not perfect.

Connely Baldwin reported on the Bear Lake storage. Storage level low for the season was 5912.32 feet and ended the season higher due to the rains in August and September. Some reduction possible in 2015 but should still be close to a full allocation. Pacificorp will be drawing down Alexander reservoir probably in August in order to replace spill gates. He reported that they did the same on Cutler reservoir last year to very little effect. Current snow pack levels were shown with most being at or slightly above normal.

Michael Holliday of IDWR spoke of the adjudication process and recommended contacting legislators to encourage them to act on it this year. He discussed several advantages to doing it now, including:

- Available and knowledgeable personnel on staff.
- Would solidify water rights making them more valuable.
- Would allow enlargement claims where covered acreage had increased.
- Would clear up usage changes since the decrees more than 100 years ago.

Micah Jensen asked if statutory claims of water claimed after the decrees would be recognized. Michael responded yes if usage was before 1971. He added that claims were only as good as water available and are not necessarily a water right. There was considerable discussion of the possibility of losing water in an adjudication, but most of those concerns were allayed if water was being used and usage was recorded. Kerry Romrell spoke strongly in favor of the adjudication, saying that Idaho was far behind Wyoming and Utah. Cost was discussed and determined that there would probably be a \$50 per claim fee plus \$1 per acre claimed. Pete Petersen also spoke in favor of the adjudication saying it would especially help during short years to determine who gets what.

Matt Anders from IDWR talked of the water right accounting model. Starts in Wyoming and goes to the Great Salt Lake. Presented the flow accounting program for 2014, listing storage and natural flows and remaining storage. New accounting program has been completed. When flows from Wyoming drop too low, an emergency exists and flows need to be brought up to minimum, then Wyoming gets 43% and Idaho gets 57%. He stated that flows dropped in 2014 below the 350 CFS level resulting in the emergency for a time.

Austin Moses presented the financial statements for the previous year. The statements were approved. He also presented the proposed budget for the 2015 year. Bill Robison moved to approve the budget. Pete Peterson seconded. Motion carried. Austin presented a list of overdue assessments and received some help in contacting the individuals.

Connely Baldwin said that Josh requested use of a personal ATV and reimbursement by the District. Connely recommended approval and that the District reimburse Josh \$25 per hour for use and that the travel policy be updated to allow. Pete Peterson moved to approve the recommendation. Bill Robison seconded. Motion carried.

Meeting adjourned at approximately 3:40 p.m.
