Dear Mr. Wallace:

The above referenced petition was received by the Idaho Department of Water Resources ("Department") on January 24, 2014. The Department has reviewed and considered your petition for appointment of a lateral manager on the Ellis Subdivision Lateral.

The Department hereby denies your petition. In accordance with Idaho Code § 42-1301, lateral water users have until the last Monday of March of each year (or March 31, 2014) to meet and form a lateral water users association and elect a lateral manager. As noted in your petition, the Department appointed Dave McFarland as lateral manager last year. The Department contacted Mr. McFarland on February 10, 2014 to determine whether he would have any continued interest in serving as a lateral manager this year. Mr. McFarland indicated that he would be willing to serve as lateral manager in 2014. The lateral users therefore have a well qualified and neutral candidate that they can elect on their own. The uses have sufficient time to hold a meeting and elect a lateral manager. The Department has limited resources. It should not be expected to continuously appoint a lateral manager simply because the lateral users fail to cooperate with each other. The lateral users to exercise that responsibility.

PETITION FOR APPOINTMENT OF LATERAL MANAGER OF THE ELLIS SUBDIVISION LATERAL MANAGER OF THE ELLIS SUDIVISION LATERAL PURSUANT TO IDAHO CODE &42-1308

Jerold W. Wallace hereby petitions the Director of the Idaho Department of Water Resources (hereinafter, the "Director") pursuant to Idaho Code &42-1308 to appoint a lateral manager for the Ellis Subdivision Lateral (as described below) located in Lemhi County, Idaho. The Petitioner owns water rights that are authorized for delivery through the Ellis Subdivision Lateral, along with other water right owners as described in the attached Exhibit #1.

A certain diversion diverts water from Smout Creek at a point of diversion located in the SW1/4NE1/4NE1/4 of Section 31, Township 23N, Range 23E, in Lemhi County Idaho, into a common ditch system known as the "Ellis Subdivision Lateral." The Ellis Subdivision Lateral is more particularly described as follows:

1. An existing open earthen ditch commonly referred to as the "Upper Ditch" which originates at the Ellis Subdivision Lateral Diversion and continues in a generally southwesterly and easterly direction across properties owned by non-Association Members John and Debbie Jakovac, and properties owned by Association Members Bessie Halverson, Jack and Diane Ellis and Jerold Wallace. The Upper Ditch terminates at the irrigation device described herein as the "bubbler". There is a measuring device in the drainage below the Upper Ditch upstream of the bubbler where the flows leaves the property owned by association members Jack and Diane Ellis and enters Association member property Jerold W. Wallace. The approximate location of the Ellis Subdivision Lateral is depicted on the map attached as Exhibit #2.

Disputes have arisen between the Association Members, Jerold W. Wallace and the Spokesperson/water manager on behalf of Don Halverson, Jack Ellis, and Lee Lieberman. The person holding the position of Water Management and Spokesperson is Dave Ellis. He runs commercial Livestock on all three of the properties claiming this gives him a Beneficial right to water use above all legal Deeded Water right holders. I.E.: Jerold W. Wallace, Lucy Littlejohn, and Andrea Clifton.

Dave Ellis has gone as far as assaulting Jerold W. Wallace over the use of Deeded water rights. Assault 2012. Exhibit #3

Attempts have been made with legal counsel for water right deliveries to the Wallace measuring device. All attempts have been ignored by Jack and Dave Ellis claiming Cattle have a priority in Idaho over all Deeded Water Rights.

After all the legal litigation Don Halversoh, Jack Ellis, and Lee Lieberman refused proper water delivery to the measuring device on the Wallace property. But yet they demanded use of the Wallace Sprinkler system for the Lee Lieberman property. See actual conversations that took place thru legal counsel during May 2013. Exhibit #4

The disputes that occurred were during High flow, medium flow and low flow.

Jerold W. Wallace has been notified by letter, via legal counsel, never to set foot on Don Halverson's property. (Exhibit #5) Jerold W. Wallace is not allowed on any portion of the Upper Ditch. This has been also enforced by Threats and Assault at Jerold W. Wallace's front door step by Spokesperson Dave Ellis.

All the properties within this irrigation system have varying water rights which Spokesperson Dave Ellis is suggesting the 1915 rights not be honored.

Dave McFarland of Carmen, Idaho, volunteered for water season 2013 but the season was over as of date of his appointment.

The entire group of water users have a major break down trying to agree on any issues.

Therefore, Petitioner Jerold W. Wallace requests:

- 1. The Director appoint a Lateral manager for the Ellis Subdivision Upper Ditch and fix his compensation (Idaho Code & 42-1308)
- 2. That such lateral manager exercises the duties of the association officers to make and collect assessments to achieve the proper allocation and distribution of water from the Ellis Subdivision Upper Ditch. (Idaho Code & 42-1308).
 - 3. That such appointment be for water year 2014 entire irrigation season. (Idaho Code & 42-1308).

Dan:

Jack is going to check his weir which is just below where he diverts to see how much is going past to Jerry and others. It was at a 7 before, which is what they understand is sufficient for the users below. I suspect there is cooler weather, and reduced flows in the creek. With low water, water needs to be delivered to everyone, so I am working to get the adjustments made to ensure more water to the lower users.

I am working through your MOU, which had more changes that I anticipated, so I hope to get back to you quickly. One question I have is the first additional paragraph regarding the recitals. I don't think the recitals are contractual but simply provide background. Perhaps you can explain to me why you think this is a necessary provision.

I'll get back to you with more questions.

>Sunday May 19, Dave Ellis completed his water regulation and my weir dropped to .32 on staff =.42 CFS. Dave was running 16 sprinklers. Lucy wanted to flood irrigate. Andrea is relying on flood irrigation at this point also.

The 3 of our water rights equal 1.11 CFS not including Lieberman's right. Flood water going to Lieberman is in excess like 3 times his water right if not more. None of Lieberman's right is measured.

The water was restored to .89 CFS Monday 5/20/13 at which time I reopened the BFV. Still far below our rights.

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Kellers have diverted waste water into the upper ditch at the point of Jack Ellis's sprinkler system. This enables Dave to divert all water at Halverson's from the Upper Ditch and still he cannot deliver water to Jerry, Lucy, and Andrea.

Halverson and Ellis continue to demand more water than they are entitled to. Monday evening I shutdown my entire system so Lucy would have enough water to irrigate.

Dave is still taking as much as possible at that time.

I have to go into a rotation with Lucy so Andrea and her have water.

I have very little waste water and for the past 2 weeks Halverson, Ellis, and Lieberman have been taking 75% of all water out of the Upper Ditch.

My K-Lines only use 1.11 GPM per head.

Also Dave Ellis is making all the diversion changes at the Head of the Ditch, Halversons, Lieberman's, and Jack Ellis's property.

He is in full control of all water being delivered to the other properties.

Friday evening I had sufficient water, but by Sunday night Dave Ellis had cut the water back below required water rights.

Halverson's diversion is way above and beyond any legal right.

How do they claim they are only taking 180 GPM at Halverson's when there is no weir?

The excess water at Halverson's is then diverted in the lower ditch to Lieberman's.

Lee gets water from the runoff at Halverson's, the bubbler and the Lower Ditch. He is getting 3 sources of water.

If the bubbler does not overflow than Andrea and Lucy are being deprived of their water rights.

How do we monitor what Dave is doing above us when they have dams installed in the ditch and regulation is done with a shovel?

is attempting to contact him to turn some additional water into the
> system to ensure there is sufficient water for everyone. Once we get
the
> MOU done, Brian will do the adjusting.

> Jack did say that it appeared that all of Jerry's sprinklers are
running,
> and if there are issues, they will adjust ASAP. Also, we do not know
if
> Lucy has sprinkler pipe, so they can't tell if she is irrigating
either.
> However, if she is not getting sufficient water, adjustments can
certainly be made.
> Lastly, I should point out that there may be some ditch loss between
the
> Ellises diversion and the bubbler because the ground is not saturated
yet. My experience is that this is not unusual early in the Springs.

Dear Mr. Wallace:

My law firm represents Bessie Halverson and her family who owns the ranch that David Ellis leases in Carmen, Idaho, and who you are familiar with. It is my understanding that you are the neighbor to the Smout Creek property. It is also my understanding that you have been illegally entering the property and creating problems with Dave Ellis. My clients have placed a gate on the road into their property with no trespassing signs, but you have ignored those and continue to trespass onto the property. Your claim that another neighbor gets to use that easement is correct; he has been granted specific permission for his use only and you have no such right to use that easement and permission cannot be granted by the neighbor for you to use said easement. You do not have an easement to use their land to travel across said property and that any such use will be inconsistent with the general use of the property as is and any prior permission granted by third parties, prior lease-holders, or anyone other than Bessie or her two sons is specifically removed.

The Halversons and Mr. Ellis are specifically prohibiting you from entering the property without permission from Ms. Halverson or her sons Don or Dann Halverson. We do not want to take legal action but we will if you continue to trespass and we will also seek damages and attorney's fees. If you have any questions, please contact me directly.

Upper Ditch, Point of Diversion Transfer, Waste Water and Main Line:

Don Halverson, Lee Lieberman, and Jack Ellis are all represented by Dave Ellis. He manages all of their water in return for his commercial Livestock operation. Jack Ellis sold 4 parcels of property with a covenance prohibiting commercial livestock on all of these properties including his own 20 acres. He has enforced this on all parcels but now is saying his son Dave Ellis has rights over the landowners to graze cattle for commercial use on any of the parcels he has sold.

Jack Ellis has stated over and over again that the Historical use of water to the Lee Lieberman property was distributed from a point on his property.

Jack Ellis and Jerold W. Wallace have both installed a pipeline, 6" in diameter, to supply a sprinkler system for irrigation. Same diameter as the Wallace system.

Jerold W. Wallace has engineering stating a 6" diameter pipe with the rise and fall of his system will deliver .32 CFS Maximum flow.

Jack Ellis changed Lee Lieberman's historical diversion from his property to the Bubbler system on the Wallace Property. Jack Ellis contends a 6" pipe is more than sufficient to supply water to Jerold W. Wallace, Lucy Littlejohn, Andrea Clifton, and Lee Lieberman.

Dave Ellis testified the above ground Main Line on the Wallace property did not leak and works fine. In fact he called Jerold W. Wallace and Lucy Littlejohn a "LIAR" when we testified the Main Line was leaking and damaging our properties with leakage. Jerold Wallace buried that portion of Main Line to stop the damage.

Jack Ellis and Lee Lieberman are presently suing Jerold W. Wallace over the use of the main line. Dave Ellis is their spokesperson and is the person behind the lawsuits for his commercial Livestock operation.

Jerold W. Wallace and Lucy Littlejohn are suing Jack Ellis and Lee Lieberman over the Commercial Livestock operation on parcels that Jack Ellis guaranteed would not be present for a period of 25 yrs following the sale of his Property. Jack and Diane Ellis and Lee Lieberman are claiming Jack Ellis can change the covenance to allow Dave Ellis to graze his commercial Livestock because Idaho is actually a free range state.

Main Line Issue:

The main Line above ground pipe can be removed from the Jerold W. Wallace property. There is more than sufficient pipe to reattach to the riser on the Jack Ellis property. Run the mainline pipe thru the culvert, that is already present beneath the road, to supply Lee Lieberman's Sprinkler system. This would recreate the true Historical delivery point to Lee Lieberman. Jack Ellis has a 6" buried pipeline, plus by going this route creates a higher head PSI on the pipeline to give Lee Lieberman more head PSI for his historical sprinkler system. Jack Ellis and Lee Lieberman could drop their lawsuit against Jerold W. Wallace on behalf of their spokesperson Dave Ellis.

Lucy Littlejohn and Andrea Clifton both have historical water irrigation from the unnamed drainage. Flood irrigation.

Brian Keller stated in our phone conference on Jan 16, 2014 with James Cefalo, that the Keystone Ranch/Wolfley diversion point could supply Jerold W. Wallace change, for Point of Diversion, to the unnamed drainage but only have enough water for this one request of .49 CFS.

Jerold W. Wallace would no longer utilize the upper ditch for water rights.

Jerold W. Wallace would no longer have a need to pay a Lateral Ditch manager for the Upper Ditch.

Jerold W. Wallace does have a measuring device where the drainage water from the Upper Ditch enters his property. Jack Ellis, Lee Lieberman and Don Halverson would still be responsible to supply Deeded Water Rights for Lucy Littlejohn and Andrea Clifton to that point of measuring.

Jack Ellis and Lee Lieberman would have no reason to sue Jerold W. Wallace on behalf of Dave Ellis.

As Dave Ellis testified the above Ground Main Line does not have any issues with leakage so transferring to the true Historical source for Lee Lieberman should be no problem. The connection of the Main Line to the Jack Ellis system would be on the riser below the Jack Ellis Home, far side of pond.

Waste Water Application:

Once the main line issue is resolved then Jack Ellis and Lee Lieberman could drop their complaint against Jerold W. Wallace for his application for a Waste Water Complaint.

Jack Ellis could not deprive Jerold W. Wallace of his deeded water rights claiming his right to move deeded water rights uphill and stating the waste water is present and he has a beneifical right above and beyond any deeded water rights. His Beneficial right is for the commercial Livestock operation Dave Ellis is running.

Lee Lieberman could drop his complaint for the same reason.

All this said and done DAVE ELLIS would have no reason to set foot on Jerold W. Wallace's property. Dave Ellis claims he has a right to trespass on the Jerold W. Wallace's property even after he claims his assault to Jerold W. Wallace 1.5 yrs ago, at Jerold W. Wallace's front door step, was strictly in self defense. Even though Jerold W. Wallace never struck Dave Ellis. Jerold W. Wallace suffered 8 fractures of his left eye socket orbital bone, and 10 broken teeth.

Jerold W. Wallace does not want Dave Ellis coming onto his property and defending himself again. Doesn't like being left at his front doorstep for DEAD!

A user-agreed description of the Upper Ditch Delivery System is as follows:

(1) An existing open earthen ditch commonly referred to as the "Upper Ditch", which originates at the Ellis Subdivision Lateral Diversion in Smout Creek and continues in a generally southwesterly and westerly direction across property owned by non-users John and Debbie Jakovac and properties owned by users: Bessie Halverson, Jack and Diane Ellis, and Jerold Wallace. The "Upper Ditch" portion terminates at an irrigation device described herein as the "bubbler". There are measuring devices in the "Upper Ditch" upstream from the "bubbler" at the ditch's diversion point from Smout Creek, at a point on the Ellis property where they withdraw their water, and at a point where the "Upper Ditch" crosses the common boundary between the Ellis and Wallace property.

(2) An existing irrigation device known the "bubbler" which was installed by Mr. Wallace's predecessor -in - interest on the property now owned by Mr. Wallace. This "bubbler" collects Smout Creek water conveyed through the "Upper Ditch" and waste water from the neighboring Keystone Ranch. The "bubbler" raises the commingled water level to build head pressure to deliver the commingled water to user members: Jerold Wallace, Lucy Littlejohn, Lee and Ann Lieberman and Andrea Clifton. The "bubbler" conveys the commingled water to the pipelines described below.

(3) An existing buried pipeline, herein designated as the "bubbler pipeline" which originates at the "bubbler" and extends in a south-westerly direction across Mr. Wallace's property to convey commingled water from the "bubbler" to the beginning of a surface mainline.

(4) A surface mainline that begins at the down stream end of the "bubbler pipeline" and extends in a southerly direction, along the common boundary of the properties owned by Wallace and Littlejohn, to a buried section of mainline that extends under a cul – de – sac road to deliver water to the Lieberman and Clifton properties.

(5) A buried section of mainline under the cul – de – sac road.

(6) A surface mainline extending from the downstream end of the buried section to where the surface mainline ends along the common boundary of the properties owned by Lieberman's and Clifton.

Mr. Wallace has filed a petition with IDWR for the appointment of a lateral manager on the Upper Ditch Delivery System for 2014. I/we would like to be notified immediately of any decision you or your department makes regarding this petition. Mr. David McFarland was appointed by IDWR as lateral manager for the Upper Ditch Delivery System in 2013. I/we would like to recommend that Mr. McFarland be re-appointed as lateral manager, upon his consent, for the 2014 season.

As the water users on the Upper Ditch Delivery System have no formal association, I/we would also recommend that Mr. McFarland be given authority to collect and hold the water assessments, set by IDWR, for payment of his salary and minor, user-approved repairs or maintenance of the Upper Ditch Delivery System.
